



Ride Safe Indiana (RSI) Fact Sheet

MISSION: Training more motorcyclists and educating motorists to decrease motorcycle fatalities and accidents.

VISION: Create a lifelong learning program and promote motorcycle awareness to ensure the safety of all riders

- Provide more training opportunities for Basic and Advanced Rider Courses with multiple providers
- Single-source curriculum to ensure consistency in training
- Centralized online registration system for riders
- Quality assurance of training providers
- Invest in an updated motorcycle fleet
- Professional development of Rider Courses
- Statewide awareness campaign

Training provider commits to:

- Setting the cost to the rider with no tuition cap
- Submitting course information for online registration
- Using Rider Coaches recognized by RSI
- Using Motorcycle Safety Foundation curriculum
- Partnering with RSI for quality assurance visits

RSI commits to:

- Reimbursing providers \$125 per rider
- Providing motorcycle fleet for training
- Authorizing providers to distribute waivers of skills and written tests

Timeline:

- Oct. 19, 2015—Public Town Hall to introduce RSI
- Oct. 26, 2015—Interested providers will indicate intent to participate
- Dec. 1, 2015—Contracts will be executed and training schedules submitted
- Jan. 1, 2016—Riders can begin registering for training courses statewide
- Feb. 19-21, 2016—RSI at the Indiana Motorcycle Expo
