

Scrapie Identification Information for Producers

The interstate identification rule is a federal requirement and official identification cannot be legally removed. Scrapie Program Flock tags include the flock ID and individual production number. The flock ID number is the number that must appear on producers' tags and/or tattoos and records/paperwork (including certificates of veterinary inspection). BOAH will provide/approve the Flock ID number for each site. In most cases, this number includes the state postal code and county number. All of these tags will have the USDA shield present.

- Under Indiana guidelines, recognized identification methods are the same for sheep and goats. Accepted methods include: Scrapie Program Flock tags, tattoos and microchips (where recognized by a registry).
- Tattoos must be applied legible to the ear, tail, or flank in their entirety.
- Registry tattoos may be used as a Flock ID only with approval of BOAH and the animal must be moved with the registration papers. Whenever possible, BOAH will incorporate the registry number into the Flock ID.
- "In-and-out" or seasonal flocks, in which no birthing takes place, are not required to have a flock identification number. The owners may choose to obtain federal tags or have their

sheep or goats identified by a veterinarian or extension educator for exhibit/sale. (This exception includes 4-Hers who only have animals for 4-H, then sell them after the season. These individuals' lambs or goats should have a tag or tattoo upon purchase.)

- Indiana law requires wethers have identification for exhibition. However, they do not have to have the official federal identification unless 18 months of age or older. In-tact males and females must have official federal identification regardless of age.
- Wethers intended to be used for exhibition or sale must be identified by any type of tag or tattoo. Federal identification tag or tattoo (approved) is required for wethers older than 18 months of age.
- All sexually intact males and females of any age and wethers over 18 months of age that are sold thru a sale barn/livestock markets must be identified with a Scrapie program flock tag. If presented to the market without an appropriate tag, the sale barn/market will apply a tag. There may be a small charge by the sale barn/market for applying the tag.

***Registered Sheep or Goats:
Select one of these identification options:***

1. Scrapie Program Flock Tag:

Step 1-Call BOAH (877-747-3038)

Step 2-Obtain a Flock ID number

Step 3-Order tags which include the flock ID and production numbers for each individual animal (Please refer to ordering information on the following page)

Step 4-Apply tags according to Indiana guidelines

2. Microchip: Where recognized by registry

Step 1-Call BOAH (877-747-3038)

Step 2-Obtain a Flock ID number

Step 3-Microchip registered animals only

Step 4-Provide reader device to verify identity at any inspection/sale along with registration papers.

3. Tattoo:

Step 1-Call BOAH (877-747-3038)

Step 2-Obtain Flock ID number

Step 3-Tattoo legibly all registered animals, with approved number and a unique, individual animal number.

Step 4-All movements must be accompanied by the registration paperwork. Registration tattoos are not approved for movements to/through salebarns and livestock markets.

2. Tattoo:

Step 2-Obtain Flock ID number

Step 3-Apply legibly (ear, tail and flank are acceptable) the Flock ID tattoo along with unique, individual animal number. Unregistered members of a flock must bear the Flock ID in its entirety with the animal's individual ID.





Do Not Let Your Sheep or Goats Leave Home Without Scrapie Tags



- By Indiana law all sheep/goats are required to have official eartags/identification before they leave the farm. *(The only exception is wethers younger than 18 months of age.)*
- The producer is responsible for ensuring sheep/goats are officially identified before leaving the farm.
- Because applying eartags is labor intensive and time consuming for the livestock auctions and dealers, producers may be charged a fee for the service if animals go to market without official ID.

Sheep and goat producers may obtain approved tags from the following companies:

When ordering tags, be sure to order tags approved by the USDA scrapie eradication program. The owner must provide his/her flock ID. To obtain a flock ID, contact the Indiana State Board of Animal Health or complete the application on the other side of this flyer.

APPLICATION FOR PREMISES ID AND FLOCK ID

- *Indiana state law requires premises registration on all sites associated with the sale, purchase, and/or exhibition of livestock including sheep and goats.*
- *If you are breeding sheep and/or goats (i.e., producing lambs and/or kids), use one of the options below to obtain the required flock ID for your flock/herd.*
