- Re: Earning CTE Concentrator Status, Perkins IV or Perkins V

## Background

In light of recent and frequent changes to state policy regarding CTE Concentrator status, schools pursuing the CTE Concentrator pathway as a means to meet high school graduation postsecondary readiness competencies will be allowed a grace period to adjust to these changes.

## Guidance

Graduation cohorts 2019-2022 are eligible to utilize either the <u>Perkins IV or Perkins V</u> definition of concentrator.

To alleviate the hardships of this transition period on schools, the protocol below should be followed:

- 1. For students in graduation cohorts 2019-2022 and pursuing the <u>Perkins IV concentrator</u> pathway, the <u>2018-2019 Course Titles and Descriptions</u> should be followed.
- 2. For students in graduation cohorts 2019-2022 and pursing the <u>Perkins V concentrator</u> pathway, the <u>2019-2020 Course Titles and Descriptions</u> should be followed.
- 3. For all students beginning with the 2023 cohort, only the Perkins V concentrator pathway must be followed.
