MUNCIE, IND. – College students enrolled in Indiana’s 21st Century Scholars program came together from across the state on the campus of Ball State University this month for the inaugural Next Steps College Conference. Sponsored by the Indiana Commission for Higher Education, Learn More Indiana, Ball State University and Ivy Tech Community College (Muncie) the event is part of an ongoing effort to help 21st Century Scholars complete college and prepare for success in their chosen career path.
