Commissioner to meet with local leaders about higher education in Hendricks County

DANVILLE, IND. – Indiana Commissioner for Higher Education Teresa Lubbers will continue her statewide “College Success Tour” tomorrow at 8 a.m. at the Hendricks County Fairgrounds.

Indiana’s education attainment level and personal per capita income are two data points that are directly linked to the fact that only a third of Hoosier adults have more than a high school diploma. Indiana has set a goal of increasing the proportion of Hoosiers with a college credential, including one-year workforce certificates, two-year associate degrees and four year bachelor’s degrees, to 60 percent of the state’s population by 2025.

College Success Summits

Sponsored by the Indiana Commission for Higher Education, the regional “College Success Summits” events are hosted by a county College Success Coalition, a growing statewide network of local organizations working to increase college access and success. The events are part of an ongoing public engagement effort designed to increase the education level of all Hoosiers.
