


Hispanic and Latino Students

High School Pipeline and College Preparation

- 9% of high school graduates are Hispanic and Latino
- The percentage of Hispanic and Latino high school graduates has increased 5 percentage points in the last 10 years
- 67% of Hispanic and Latino high school graduates come from a low-income household
- 53% of Hispanic and Latino high schoolers earn AP or dual credit
- 26% of Hispanic and Latino high school graduates earned an Academic Honors diploma


College Going Rates by Gender



College Access

- 51% of Hispanic and Latino high school graduates go straight to college. The statewide average is 61%


College-Going Rates by Socioeconomic Status



Early Success in College


- 39% of Hispanic and Latino students meet all three early college success metrics (no remediation; complete all attempted credits; persist to second year)


Hispanic/Latino Students' On-Time Two-Year Institution Completion



On-Time Completion

- 16% of Hispanic and Latino Hoosiers graduate from two-year campuses on time
- 37% of Hispanic and Latino Hoosiers graduate from four-year campuses on time


Hispanic/Latino Students' On-Time Four-Year Institution Completion




Extended-Time Completion

- 56% of Hispanic and Latino Hoosiers graduate from college within 6 years

Dual Credit and Completion

- Students who earned AP or dual credit in high school were more likely to graduate college on-time and to graduate at all
