


HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATES ARE BECOMING MORE DIVERSE




GEOGRAPHY

51% of Lake and Marion high school graduates were low-income








COLLEGE-GOING RATES

Men are less likely to go to college right after high school (HS class of 2019 college-going rates)




COMPLETIONS AT TWO-YEAR INSTITUTIONS

- Indiana GEAR UP (Purdue University College of Education)
 - Current 11th and 12th grade students
 - At nine corporations and 11 high schools (majority F/RL)
 - Scholar Success Program for All
 - Pre-pandemic disruptions, our cohorts were not only on pace with Scholars statewide, but were also outpacing Scholars across the state at the same grade levels.
 - Keys to success: School leadership/district buy-in and embracing outside partners during the school day





- Indiana Youth Institute and Indiana Afterschool Network
 - Conferences, exhibiting opportunities, dedicated webinars
 - Primary goal is awareness around 21st Century Scholars
 - **Key**: Getting our programs in front of youth-serving professionals who often support outside of the classroom

 - Highlighting the disparities that exist in current outcomes for Black and Latinx students
 - Connect more intentionally with efforts that are happening at the local/school-level
