2025 LEGISLATIVE SESSION OVERVIEW

- ► The legislative session began November 19 with Organization Day.
- ► The House and Senate reconvened January 8.
- The third reading deadline is February 20 for both chambers.
- The **second half** of session begins March 3.
- The legislature must adjourn no later than April 29.



2025 LEGISLATIVE SESSION OVERVIEW

- ► The Indiana General Assembly has filed over 1,200 bills.
- ► The Commission is **tracking 181 bills** focused on PK-12, higher education, and the workforce.

SB 448 – HIGHER EDUCATION AND WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT MATTERS

- ▶ **SB 448** is an agenda bill of Governor Braun, Office of the Secretary of Education, and the Commission.
- ► The bill has four components which raise academic standards, increase education and training beyond high school, and address workforce challenges.



SB 448 – HIGHER EDUCATION AND WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT MATTERS

- Refreshes the Degree Program Approval and Review process.
 - There are over 3,000 academic programs at public institutions.
 - Requires the Commission to consider outcomes such as labor market alignment, job placement, and credit for prior learning.
- Market-Driven Stackable Credentials and Qualifications Framework.
 - Advances the work underway for youth apprenticeships.
 - Helps enable a permeable system of education and training beyond high school.



SB 448 – HIGHER EDUCATION AND WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT MATTERS

MPH Report

Requires MPH to annually report the number and types of credentials needed to fill job openings compared to the number and types of credentials earned by Hoosiers.

Indiana Resident Enrollment

Seeks to increase the percentage of in-state students enrolled at public colleges.



HB 1049 – PUBLIC SERVICE ATTORNEY SCHOLARSHIPS

- Establishes the Public Service Attorney Scholarship.
- Charges the Commission with administering the program.
- Applicants must be admitted to an accredited Indiana law school.
- The program has a service requirement.
 - Deputy Prosecuting Attorney
 - Public Defender



HB 1111 – INDIANA NATIONAL GUARD

- ► This is the National Guard's agency bill.
- Expands the National Guard Supplemental Grant (NGSG) to in-demand apprenticeships and other approved credentials.
- Allows a recipient of the NGSG to use the award for up to two years on room and board if the recipient is also a 21st Century Scholar.



HB 1326 — STUDENT AND TEACHING SCHOLARSHIPS

- Modifies the income guidelines of the Transition to Teaching Scholarship.
- Provides the Commission with increased flexibility for administering all teaching-based scholarships.



HB 1515 – EDUCATION AND HIGHER EDUCATION MATTERS

- Amends eligibility requirements for the Workforce Ready Grant.
- Allows for students to use the award who previously earned an eligible certificate.



SB 285 – COMPARATIVE COLLEGE AND CAREER INFORMATION

- Tasks the Commission with developing an interactive website called the Student Horizon Dashboard.
- ► The dashboard would provide public access to certain information about postsecondary education, career and technical education, earnings, and debt.
- Tasks the Commission with creating and distributing a Student Graduate Horizon Scorecard.



SB 365 – EDUCATION MATTERS

- Requires the Commission to conduct a return on investment analysis for the Frank
 O'Bannon Grant, 21st Century Scholars, and Career & Technical Education.
- Requires the Department of Education to conduct a return on investment analysis for adult education programs.
- Modifies language around the Career Coaching Grant.
