Indiana's *Reaching Higher, Delivering Value* strategic plan champions policies and practices to increase college value and student success, including those outlined below.



COMPLETION

Transition Support

- Expand statewide access and student participation in summer bridge programs and related experiences that prepare recent high school graduates to transition to college successfully.
- Ensure state financial aid recipients are equipped to succeed in college through consistent placement in first-year experience courses or cohort-based student learning communities.
- Encourage community engagement and investment in pre-college preparation and student support programs.

Proactive Advising

- Simplify student choice by organizing programs of study around broad groupings of related majors, or meta-majors, that help students narrow their focus to a specific major without extending time to graduation.
- Identify career and academic milestones on college degree maps that trigger advising alerts and proactive interventions when not completed.

Competency-Based Education

- Challenge Indiana colleges to develop degree programs that are designed around competencies rather than credit hours or courses.
- Seek federal, state and philanthropic dollars to support the development of competency-based programs.

Learning Outcomes

- Develop a clear set of competencies for all courses in the state's Core Transfer Library.
- Encourage faculty to develop consistent mechanisms for evaluating program quality in alignment with nationally-recognized approaches.

COMPLETION

Transition Support

- The Freshman Connections Program includes the common reader program, which requires all new freshman to read and discuss the same book prior to the start of the semester.
- Transitional classes on study skills and choosing a major are available for students.
- Residence Life assigns freshman to residence halls based on majors when possible, encouraging students to form early connections with their major.

Proactive Advising

- Students are assigned a freshman advisor who contacts them several times during the year, including to set up a mandatory meeting in preparation for spring semester registration.
- Students complete a MapWorks survey of academic behaviors and life concerns. Residence Life employees and advisors respond when necessary.

- Tier 3—capstone—experiences require students to have an experience related to their chosen career field. These are captured using Blackboard Learn, and the results are randomly selected for review by faculty.

- Many majors include practicum, internship or student teaching experiences, and all majors require students to participate in a Tier 3—capstone—experience designed to integrate learning with the workplace.
- Each year, over 4,000 students participate in “immersive learning experiences,” or student-directed problem solving projects in partnership with a business or the local community.

COMPLETION

Transition Support

- All incoming students (including adult students and transfer students with fewer than 30 credits) are required to attend a new student orientation that includes advising, registration and a two-day comprehensive orientation.
- Many academic departments offer first-year experiences and seminars for freshman and incoming students.

Proactive Advising

- All incoming students receive specialized advising at orientation and throughout their first year.
- All new students with an undeclared major are advised into a pathway and receive customized programming designed to assist them in declaring an appropriate major.
- Returning students who are on academic probation or who have a GPA of 2.0-2.37 receive peer coaching and are enrolled in a non-credit bearing, free online student success course.

COMPLETION

Transition Support

- A three-week summer bridge program is required for students with conditional admittance. They receive intensive coaching and there is a mandatory study table during the academic year.
- Project Success is a one-week summer bridge program for students with GPAs between 2.5 and 3.2. These students are also enrolled in a college success course (UNIV 101) in the fall.

Proactive Advising

- Freshman advisors work closely with Academic Peer Advocates, paraprofessionals who live on freshman floors of residence halls in addition to Resident Assistants.
- MAPWorks is utilized throughout the school year as a form of early and quick intervention.
- Specialized program supports are available for probationary students and 21st Century Scholars.

The Indiana Commission for Higher Education collected responses from each of the state's public colleges and universities concerning the programs and supports they offer students in the five categories below.



COMPLETION

Transition Support

- Summer bridge or first-year experience courses are available for students in selected majors, for undecided majors and for under-prepared students.
- COPE student services are available to first-generation students and students with learning disabilities, and Student Support Services, a grant-funded TRIO program, supports at-risk students.
- Student Success Seminars are open to all students during the first 8 weeks of each semester.

Proactive Advising

- All students have the option to meet with Student Success coordinators who support faculty advisors by mentoring and advising students.



COMPETENCY

Competency-Based Education

- In select professional, CTE (Career and Technical Education) programs, students may earn articulated credit that reflects specific competencies.
- The university is working toward expanding competency-based options for IT (Information Technology) courses.

Learning Outcomes

- Program and course assessment is an on-going process that includes student artifacts from students at the main campus, in dual credit courses and online.
- The assessment planning process has been used as a model by other institutions of higher learning.



CAREER

Workplace Experience

- Students in select programs, such as Advanced Manufacturing, are required to participate in workplace experience. All students are strongly recommended to participate in workplace experiences.
