

CITY OF JASONVILLE
COMMON COUNCIL MEETING
DECEMBER 8,2025

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Siepman with all council members present.

A motion to accept the minutes was made by Peggy Sluder with a second by Kent May, all in favor. A motion to pay all claims was made by Brad Duncan with a second by Kathy May all in favor.

Attorney at Law, John Rowe was present at the meeting to introduce an alley closing at the Shakamak Good Samaritan Nursing Home, after his presentation a motion was made by Peggy Sluder to verbally resolute to hear the closing of the alley at the January 12th, 2026, meeting. A second was made by Brad Duncan, all in favor.

Sam Drummy, attorney at law, explained that the Hanna Field Annexation Ordinance will have to wait until the January 2026 meeting because of length of advertising. The Hanna Field Annexation was tabled until the January 2026 meeting.

Clerk Treasurer Landry presented Ordinance 2025-8, this is an amendment to the present sewer ordinance, a motion to pass Ordinance 2025-8 was made by Peggy Sluder with a second by Kent May, all in favor.

A pay request was presented from HWC in the amount of \$13,167.90, a motion to pay this claim was made by Peggy Sluder with a second by Kelly Portteus, all in favor.

A meeting was set for Monday, December 15th at 6:30 pm for additional appropriations.

A meeting was set for the end of the year on Monday, December 29th at 6pm.

Mayor Siepman announced that the city has been approved for a paving grant for 2026

Clerk Treasurer Landry informed the council that next year's health insurance will be slightly lower premiums than this year. Anthem is the company the city will be staying with.

Police Report was given by Chief VanHorn some being, 8 accidents, 134 traffic stops, 8 welfare checks, 2 civil disputes, 3 domestic disputes, and two unruly subjects.

Fire report was given by Asst Chief Mike Duckworth, 16 runs, 4 fire and 12 ems

Street department reported repairs at the Boy Scout Bldg, repairs at the Senior Citizens Bldg, put up Christmas lights and wreaths on Main Street, repaired street signs, repaired, road cuts, repaired the dump truck lights and installed salt box and snow plow and many other projects too numerous to mention.

Code Enforcement Officer Beth Strahla reported 4 abatements for trash, mailed out 15 demands for payments, took 4 animals to Sullivan Humane Shelter, and replied and called several people over trash and animals.

Superintendent Bob West reported he will be going on vacation next week.

Jon Query from HWC was present to request a 60 day extension for Graves Construction on the WTP project. A motion was made by Peggy Sluder to allow the extension with a second by Kelly Portteus all in favor. With this extension the completion date will be 2-9-2026

A committee from the Senior Citizens was present to request someone to clean their building, it was suggested contacting AARP for someone to do this.
