MARCH 10,2025

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Siepman with all council members present. The minutes were read, and a motion was made by Peggy Sluder with a second by Brad Duncan to approve the minutes, all in favor. A motion to accept the claims was made by Brad Duncan with a second by Kathy May, all in favor.

Clerk treasurer Jane Landry presented the council members with copies of the AFR for 2024, a motion to approve the AFR was made by Peggy Sluder with a second by Kathy May, all in favor. Landry also presented the council with the Salary Ordinance Amendment of 2024-18 now know as 2025-1, the amendment added the IT salary and changed the full-time employment pay to start at 90 days instead of 6 months. A motion to approve the ordinance was made by Peggy Sluder with a second by Kent May, all in favor.

A claim for HWC water treatment plant invoice for \$1830.00 was presented for payment, a motion to pay the claim was made by Peggy Sluder with a second by Brad Duncan, all in favor. Claims for Graves Construction pay application #14 Division B in the amount of \$102,677.08. A motion by Peggy Sluder and seconded by Kathy May to pay the claim, all in favor. Graves Construction pay application # 14 Division A in the amount of \$331354.72 was presented for payment, a motion by Peggy Sluder and seconded by Brad Duncan to pay the claim, all in favor.

In keeping with the new law starting July 1, 2025, to record all meetings, the council was presented with a list of equipment needed. A motion to buy the equipment needed was made by Peggy Sluder and seconded by Kelly Portteus, all in favor.

Mayor Siepman was approached by Republic to renew our trash contract now at the present rate instead of waiting until December 2025 to renew. The council agreed and a motion to renew the contract as is was made by Peggy Sluder with a second by Kelly Portteus, all in favor.

Old Business: Mayor Siepman reported on the Hanna Field Project Fund Raiser. The goal has been met and still receiving money. The fund raiser goes until April 18th.

City Park Building is almost completed. The workers are needing to stop on the building and start installing culverts for the paving project coming in April.

The Blighted Property liens are applied.

Police reported 211 incidents, some being, 5 property damage accidents, 5 personal injury accidents, and 88 traffic stops.

Fire department reported 39 runs, 8 being fire.

Street Department reported continued work on the city park building, cleaned up after the accident on Park and Main, Plowed more snow and spread salt.
