New Business

Park Dept. - Stone Fitness Quote for Treadmill

Stone Fitness come in to do service on the fitness equipment at the Rec Center. Cables were ordered for several items because they were a hazard. Repairs are being made to the equipment needing attention. We are now back on a regular maintenance schedule. Stone Fitness Equipment provided a quote to replace one of our treadmills at the Rec Center cannot be repaired. The cost including shipping is \$4,100. There are equipment funds remaining in the 2022 budget.

Police Dept. – Flock ALPR License Plate Scanner

Chief Shearer discussed the Flock ALPR License Plate Scanner system and asked for permission to proceed with the service agreement. The cost for the first year is \$5,700 for two scanners which includes the implementation fee. After that, the cost is \$5,000 per year. The agreement not only includes the two scanners, but eight cameras. Flock maintains the data for 30 days. Only license plates are scanned, there is no facial recognition. The agreement is for two years for a total of \$10,700. There are funds remaining in the 2022 budget to cover the cost for 2023.

Republic Services – 2023 Contract Extension

Republic Services provided a quote for an extension of the garbage collection services for 2023. The cost per unit increases from \$15.83 to \$16.46 (approximately 4%). The city cleanup costs would be \$111.67/hour and \$37.59/ton for landfill disposal.
