**Street Department – Employee Wage Increase for Obtaining CDL**

**Water Department – Boring Quotes for Water Pipe Leak in Elkhart River**

A broken pipe causing a large water leak was discovered in the Elkhart River. Two quotes for boring and installing a new line were received.

S & S Directional	\$300 per foot with an estimate of \$75,000 for 10” pipe
Niblock Excavating	\$185 per foot with an estimate of \$58,750 for 10” pipe
Niblock Excavating	\$215 per foot with an estimate of \$69,650 for 12” pipe

After speaking with City Engineer Jonathan Moen, Water Superintendent Jeff Boyle recommended going with Niblock at \$215 per foot for 12” pipe.

It has been a very beneficial tool.

**Building Administrator Elroy Mast**

- Have been doing frequent inspections at Star of the West Mill on their building project. Thank you to the police department for the use of their drone to do an inspection of the roof. The mill is on schedule for the completion of their project.

**Mayor Earle Franklin**

- Working with Shawn Cox, our Fire Department Inspector, to schedule inspections and bring the buildings downtown in compliance with zoning regulations.
- Thanks all of the departments who worked with Jeff Boyle and the Water Department to discover the leak.
- Appreciate Gary Cox getting the cameras up at the Recycle Center. The camera system has taken pictures that will be shared with the NE Solid Waste District at tomorrow's meeting.
