**New Business**

**Street Department – Quote for Crack and Seal of Streets**

Pavement Solutions Inc. provided their quote to Crack and Seal city streets and were able to extend the 2023 contract price for 2024 at \$0.62 per square yard. They are the only company in this area who does the crack and seal with the fiber. The agreement is not to exceed \$50,000 for the streets specified by Street Superintendent Mike Burdette.

**R.G. Zachrich – Change Order #2 – Wastewater Treatment Plant Improvement Project**

Based on Zachrich's recommendation, and due to age, an existing furnace is the largest item in the change order. In addition, there are three spools for blower piping and a new manhole grate to lower elevation to accept drainage in the drive. The total cost of the change order is an increase of \$11,008.71. Jonathan Moen of Triad recommended approval.

**Wastewater Treatment Plant – Quote for Panel at Lift Station**

Wastewater Treatment Plant Superintendent Benjamin Glowinski provided a quote from Indiana Pump Works for a new control panel at our lift station at Lincolnway. The equipment total is \$6,500 and the labor estimate is \$4,500. The lead time for the equipment is 6-8 weeks.

**Wage Recommendations**

In preparation for hiring in the Water and WWTP departments, and preparing the 2025 Salary Ordinance, we reviewed the starting wage for civil departments. We felt it necessary to increase our starting wage to an amount comparable with the current market suggested a starting wage of \$18.00 per hour to the council and they agreed. Recommendations for increases in certifications were also made and will be effective in the 2025 Salary Ordinance.

With an increase in starting wage for new employees, we are recommending the following current employees receive a pay increase effective with the pay period starting September 1, 2024.

**Building Administrator Elroy Mast**


- The house at 503 Water Street will be demoed and they plan to put a modular in.
