# **Public Safety Director / Police Chief Bryan Shearer**

- Provided an update on unsafe buildings downtown. Three properties with broken windows have been identified and owners notified, with a 10-day response period:
  - o 100 Block Ruvalcaba has been contacted and will inspect with Elroy Mast.
  - 207 S. Cavin Street Certified notice signed by Daniel Pena, but no response received; a citation will be issued.
  - 223 S. Cavin Street (Peterson property) Noted as a dangerous condition due to a one-inch structural crack; certified notice not received back; citation to be issued.

### Park Director John Parrish

Reported that the department is busy catching up on general park maintenance.

 Expressed concern over public garbage cans being misused by downtown apartment residents, especially the can near 207 South Cavin, which is frequently overflowing due to personal household waste being dumped.
