Street Superintendent Mike Burdette: Mike thanked the Marshmallow Festival Committee for their efforts in the cleanup of the city during and after the festival. He also reported that the citywide fall clean up is Saturday, September 15.

Water Superintendent Jeff Boyle: Jeff reported that the current retention tank was cleaned. The tank was in good shape as only one half inch of build up was cleaned away. Jeff was contacted by a fiber optic company requesting to go through the city right of way to bury cable. There was discussion regarding with no decision being made.

WWTP Superintendent Mark Schultz: The WWTP recently won a Safety award and a Lab Excellence award.

Building Inspector Earle Franklin: Earle noted there are certain permit fees that are not included in the rate chart. He will review the list and report back with recommendations. City Engineer Rick Pharis will also review the rates of nearby cities for comparison.
