Water Dept. – Roof Quotes

Jeff Boyle solicited quotes for the roof replacement at the water department. The following were received:

Because there was some question as to what was covered in the Yoder and Hershberger quotes, Jeff called to clarify. Response was received from Hershberger, but Yoder has not returned calls. Jeff therefore recommended Hershberger who came with high recommendations. After discussion, it was determined that Jeff should contact Yoder and give him one additional opportunity with a deadline to respond.

Because of the necessity to get the project in the works, Don Skinner asked the board to consider approving a purchase and installation not to exceed a dollar amount.
