Silgan – Sewage Bill

John Baxter, Plant Manager of Silgan was present to voice concerns over a billing for sewage which was extremely higher than normal. Their normal usage is 100,000 gallons per month and this billing was for 1,000,000 gallons for the month. Wastewater employees had been called to re-read the meters for accuracy. Further investigation uncovered a blockage in their line and their meter was submerged under water. This will cause the meter to run per Baxter, and confirmed by both Water Superintendent Jeff Boyle and Sewage Superintendent Don Skinner. The blockage has since been removed.
