Unfinished Business

1. Amended Salary Ordinance for 2012

Ordinance 820-2012 amends the current year salary ordinance to allow for the additional pay for the Public Safety Director and changes the pay of the building inspector to an hourly rate.

2. Ordinance 817-2012 (Sewer Use)

3. Ordinance 818-2012 (Imposition of Surcharges)

4. Trash Container Discussion – Draft Ordinance 819-2012

Placement and removal of trash containers by residents was discussed in the previous meeting and discussion continued. City Attorney Steve Hagen prepared a draft ordinance based on a sample from another city. The times for placement were the main issues. After discussion it was determined that 4:00 pm on the day before pick up would be the earliest containers could be set out on the street with removal by 7:00 am on the day after pick up.

Upon passage of a trash container ordinance, along with being advertised in the paper, it was recommended that a message be placed on the utility billing statements.

5. Elected Officials Salaries for 2013

A comparison of similar size cities from an IACT survey was made available to members of council. After discussion it was determined that although it would still be under the average of similar size cities, a 3% increase consistent with the other city employees would be fair for 2013.

1. Council Appointment to the Library Board

The library recommended that council appoint Constance Davis to the library board. Director Jerry Nesbit indicated that there were no other interested parties at this time.

2. Humane Society – Request for increased 2013 funding

3. City Redistricting

City Attorney Steve Hagen has the census data broken down block by block. He suggested that a committee be appointed and report back to council with a recommendation on the redistricting which must be completed by the end of 2012. The city currently has 4 districts and 1 at large. The city could redistrict into 3 districts and 2 at large. The council expressed their preference as 3 districts and 2 at large. Volunteers for the committee are: Chris Fought, Julia Bell, and Mayor Fisel.

Comments by Members of Council and Administration

Police Chief-Public Safety Director: Bryan Shearer reported that he met with full time and volunteer fire fighters. Communication is good and expectations were conveyed. He has seen a change in attitudes and moral. He is working on 911 dispatch procedures along with Fire Chief Weaver. Bryan recommended that 2013 part-time fire fighter pay be increased to \$12 per hour for primary relief and \$10 per hour for secondary relief to bring them more in line with the part-time police officer's pay. Bryan reported there is an annual grant to help with sidewalk repair available. He will be working with the school to apply for this reimbursable grant next year.

City Engineer: Rick Pharis reported that the city hall project has started. Schrock Commercial from Goshen is the contractor and Ken Wright is the project manager. On the north side project, Richmond and Martin streets have been reopened. Mercer will be closed next, then Water and Cavin. They are working with INDOT for the construction at the underpass on SR 5.

Street Superintendent: Mike reported they are getting the city ready for the festival. With the new walk to school zone in the city, it was determined for the safety of the kids, a new sidewalk should be installed on Union from Grand to the school. Three quotes have been solicited. The city will pay for the installation.

Council Member: Kelly Ware apologized for missing the special joint Council/Library meeting and thanked those who provided her with the updates.

Council President: Ken Schuman thanked City Engineer Rick Pharis and API for their cooperation on the north side project and help with the traffic problem at the mill.

Mayor Patty Fisel: The mayor reported that residents are receiving letters from Home Serve regarding their utility lines. This letter is not connected to the city; it is an advertisement for outside insurance. AEP has sent information to residents regarding the replacement of electric meters.

Mayor Fisel also commended the community for their support of the Marshmallow Festival. In only six weeks the committee has been able to put everything together to make the festival possible. She thanked committee members and the sponsors and donors for everything. The City supports the festival because it benefits the city, it is fun, it is heritage, and it is tradition.
