Citizen's Comments

Margarita White

Margarita White appeared on behalf of the Ligonier Marshmallow Festival to express her appreciation to the city for its continued support. She thanked city staff for their invaluable assistance, noting that the festival would not be possible without their efforts and the financial contributions of festival sponsors.

Margarita provided a recap of last year's festival attendance, as measured through geo-fencing data collected by Datafy in partnership with the Noble County Visitor's Bureau.

She also shared that this year's festival will take place from August 29 through September 1 and provided a brochure outlining scheduled events and times.

Unfinished Business

Parking Restrictions in Park Meadow Addition

Street Superintendent Mike Burdette provided a list of newly developed streets within the Park Meadow Addition for which he is requesting approval to implement parking restrictions on one side of each street, as well as the installation of an additional stop sign. The proposed changes are as follows:

Restricted Parking:

- Grand Teton Place: No parking on the west side, from Park Meadow Drive to Bryce Circle.
- Bryce Circle: No parking on the south side, from Grand Teton Place to Park Meadow Drive.
- Zion Hill Road: No parking on the east side, from Bryce Circle to Jennifer Drive.

Stop Sign Addition:

Zion Hill Road at Bryce Circle

Compost Site

Doug Stukey, Director of the Northeast Indiana Solid Waste District, attended the meeting to discuss the condition and operation of the city's compost site. He shared photos comparing the local site with the DeKalb County site, offering his perspective on improvements that could be made.

Doug noted that he was present at a recent grinding project at our compost site and observed a city truck delivering a mixed load of grass and tree limbs. He emphasized the importance of separating grass and tree branches, as mixing them produces a less desirable end product. The resulting mulch is not attractive to those who typically use wood chips, and this mixture complicates the grinding process.

He explained that their equipment uses different screens depending on the material—grass and leaves are ground using one screen, while branches and trees require another. Switching between materials is time-consuming and less efficient.

While Doug is willing to work with whatever material is provided, he strongly prefers separate collection to maintain a higher-quality output. He also mentioned that income from chip material is minimal—around \$50 per truckload.

Doug appreciated the city's commitment to providing this service to residents and acknowledged the challenges involved. He recommended continuing discussions with Street Superintendent Mike Burdette to coordinate more efficient pick-up and separation practices moving forward. If it is not possible to keep the materials separate, he

suggested the city consider creating a third pile specifically for mixed grass and limb debris to improve processing and final product quality.
