Comments by Members of Council and Administration

Fire Chief Jeremy Weaver

- The capital plan calls for an Aerial Truck in 2023. The lead time is approximately 15-month. We will still need to get a commitment from Redevelopment Commission to pay for the first two payments from Guardian TIF which is laid out in the capital plan. Chief Weaver asked for the approval to proceed with the plan pending the RDC commitment and order the truck now so that it arrives in 2023.
The Aerial Truck can help with the fire rating. With the new station we will have room to house an aerial.

- The construction crew continues work on the new fire station. They had to redo parts of the roofing. The front garage doors are going up this week.

Street Superintendent Mike Burdette

- Garcia, the concrete subcontractor, is working on the curbs on Martin Street.
- Will start leaf pick up the third week of October.

Park Director Travis Brimhall

- Farmers Market and Flag Football ended last Saturday.
- The new gym floor at the Rec Center should be completed by October 25.
- Water was shut off in the parks and the restrooms are now closed.

Council Member Chris Fought

- Asked about lawn clippings left on the street. Street Superintendent Burdette said the street department will pick up about once a week.
- Opinion on the COVID leave would be that it should be on everyone and not just for certain people.

Council Member Doretta Wiegand

- Inquired whether the Police Department has a chip scanner for dogs. Chief Shearer stated they do not. She will work to obtain one to scan the dogs. The majority are now chipped. It would be helpful if they Police Department had one for after hours when the Animal Clinic is closed.

Mayor Fisel's Comments

- The wage study from Baker Tilly is nearly ready for council. This will allow us to address the positions which the study shows underpaid. In addition, Mayor Fisel recommended 2.5% increase for next year for everyone.
