Indiana continues to lead the nation as a state in a strong financial position with our:

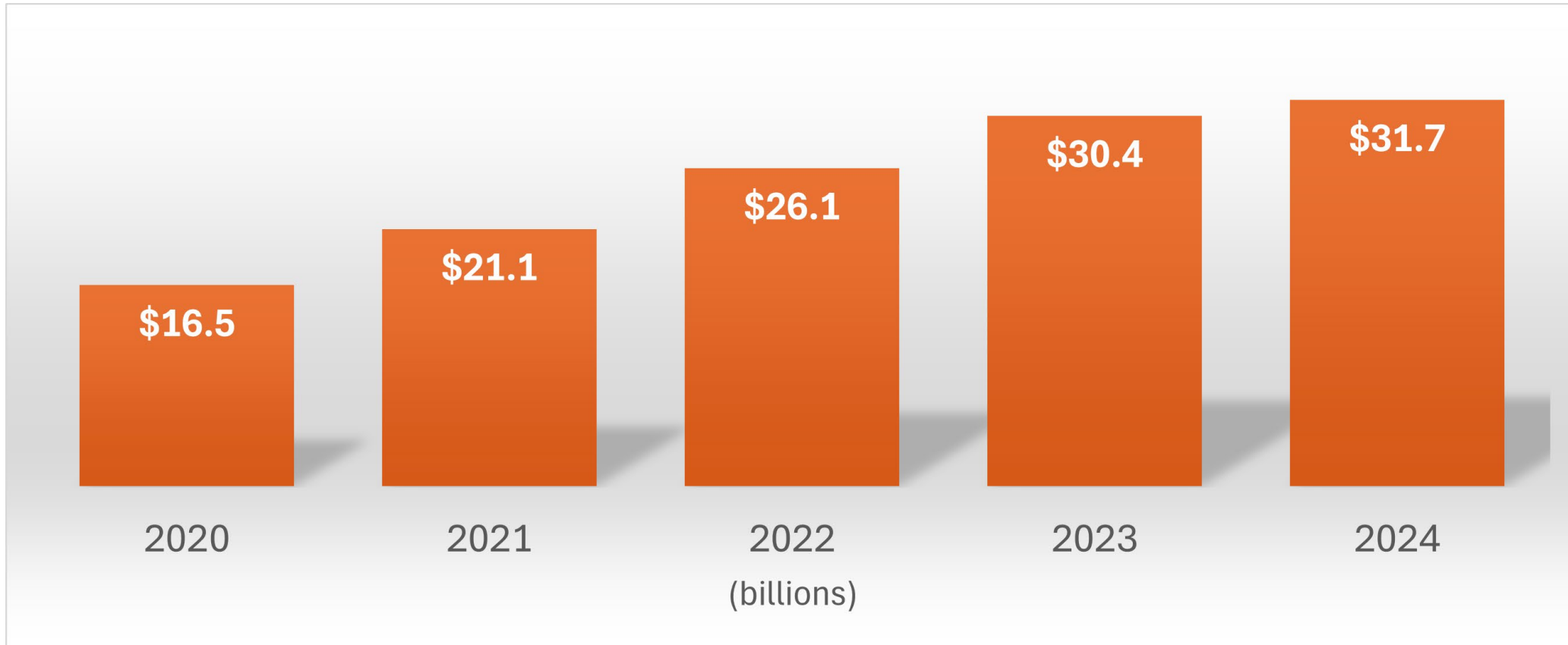
- Balanced budget

Low Debt

Indiana is the **4th lowest debt per capita** state in the nation at \$186 per person.

Debt per capita of neighboring states:

- Ohio \$804
- Michigan \$880
- Kentucky \$1,095
- Illinois \$2,751

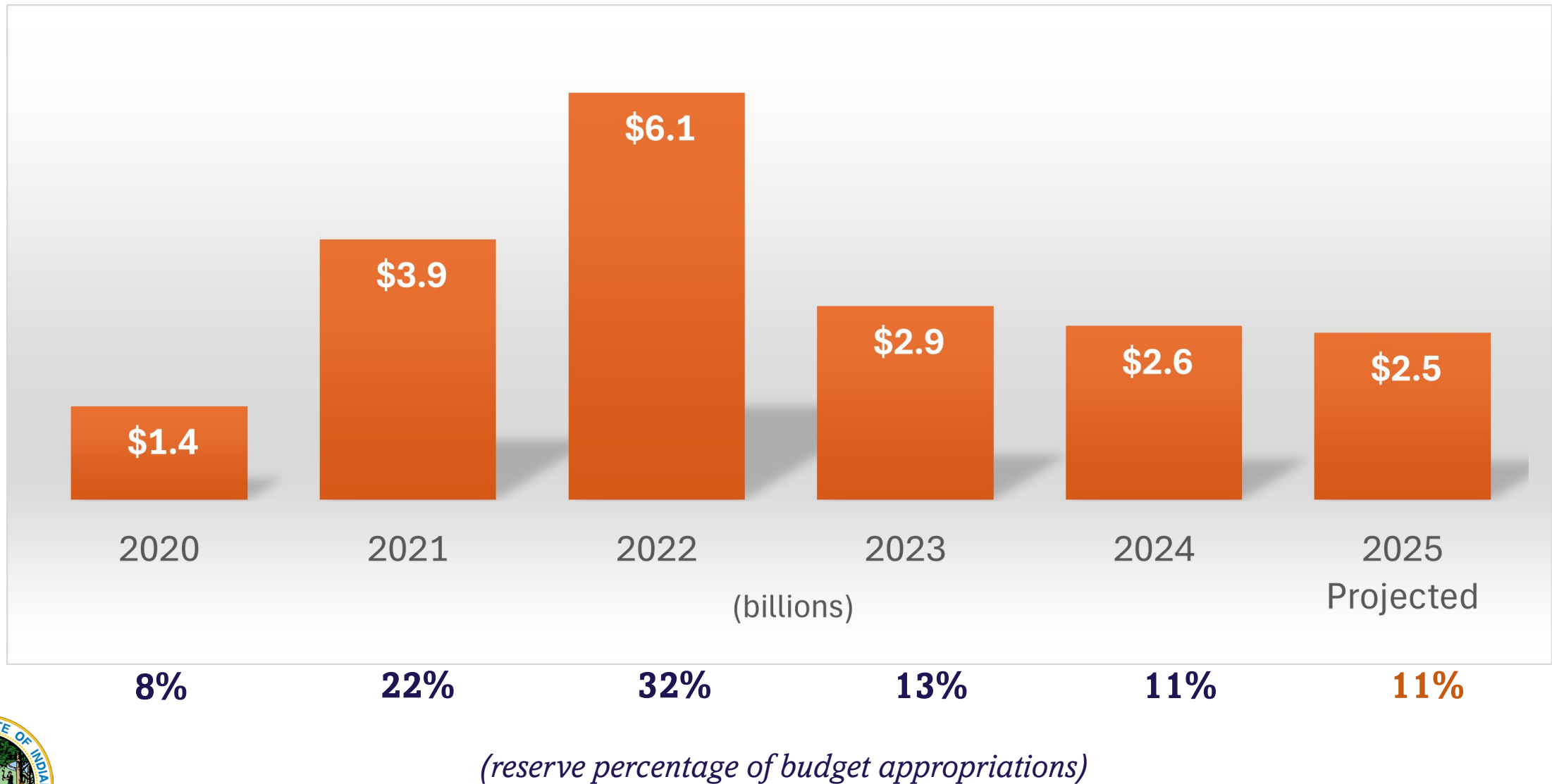
State Reserves (FY2024)

Indiana's reserves are just under \$2.6 billion – 11% of the current budget appropriations:

- \$665 million General Fund
- \$181 million Medicaid Contingency & Reserve Fund
- \$672 million Tuition Reserve Fund
- \$1.03 billion Rainy Day Fund

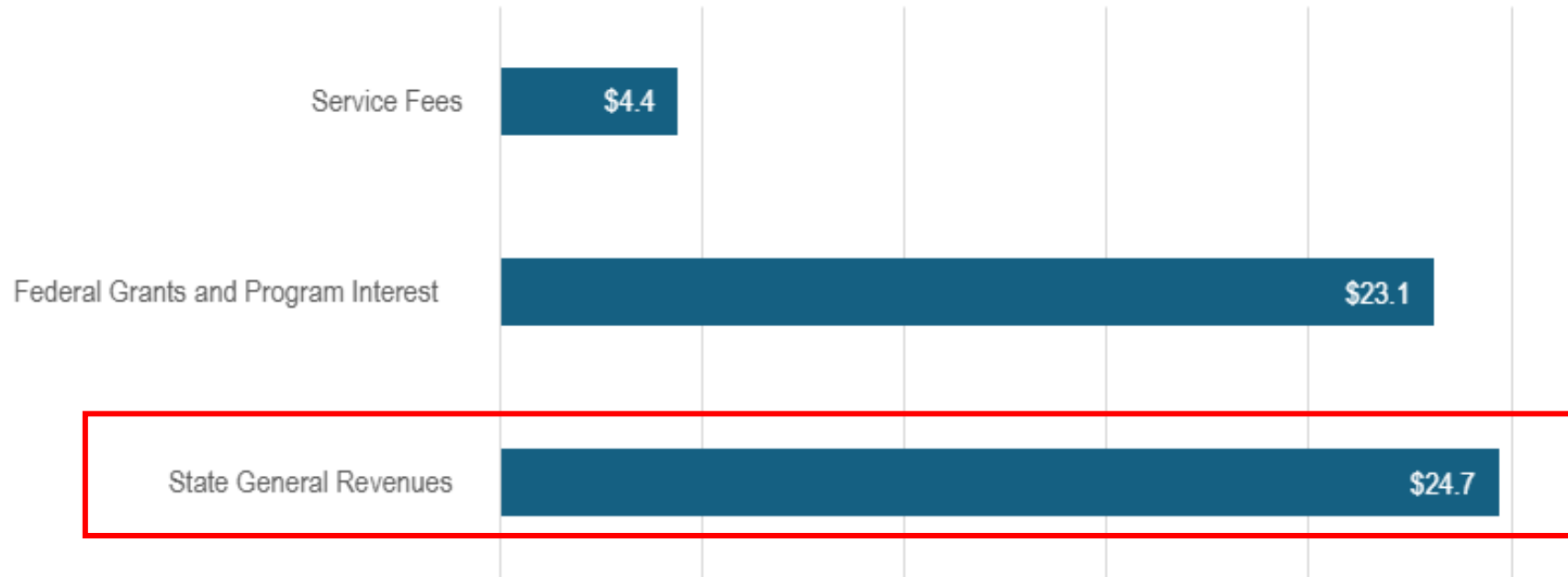

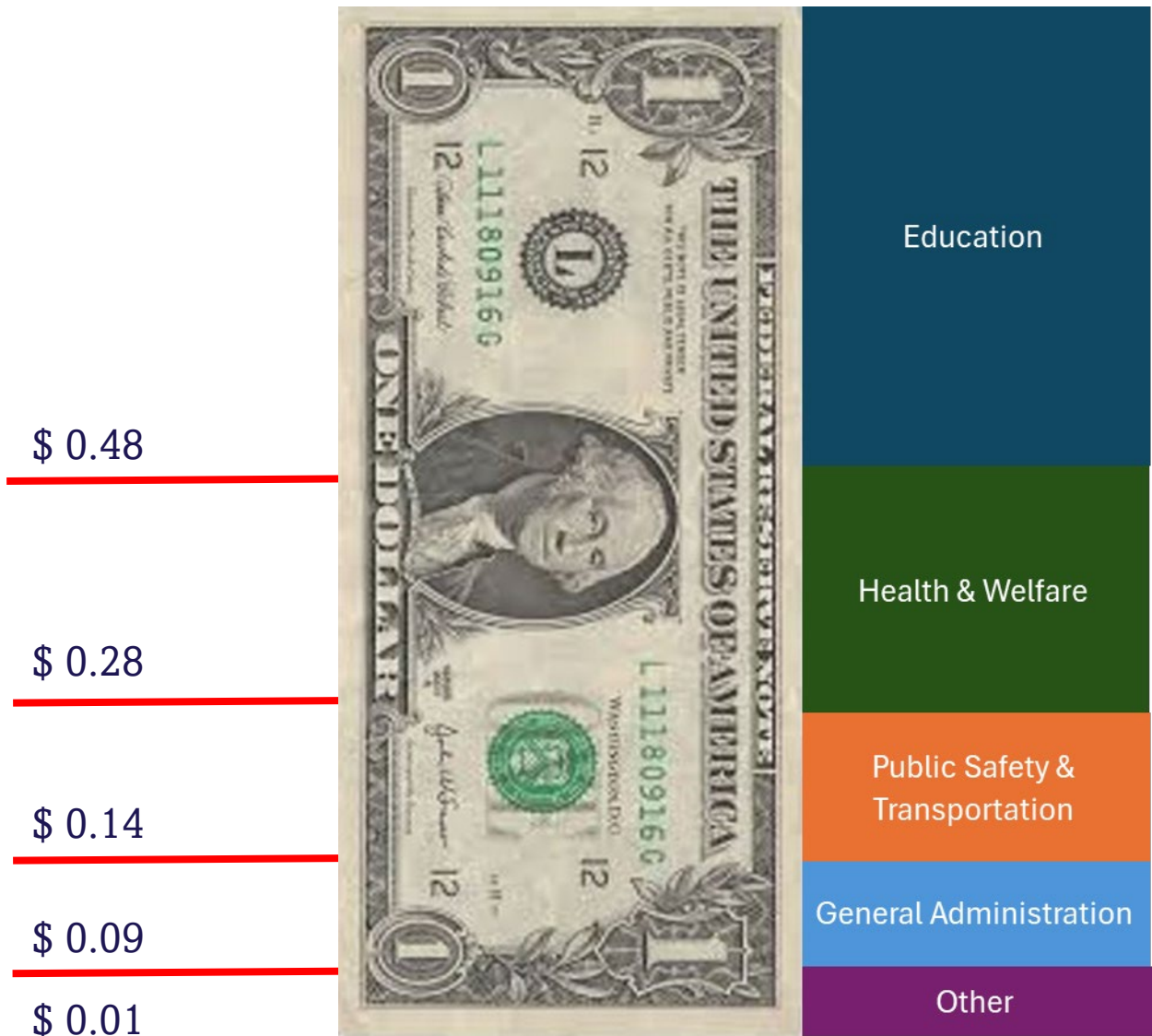


Total Revenue for Indiana (FY2024)

Total Revenue: \$52.2 Billion

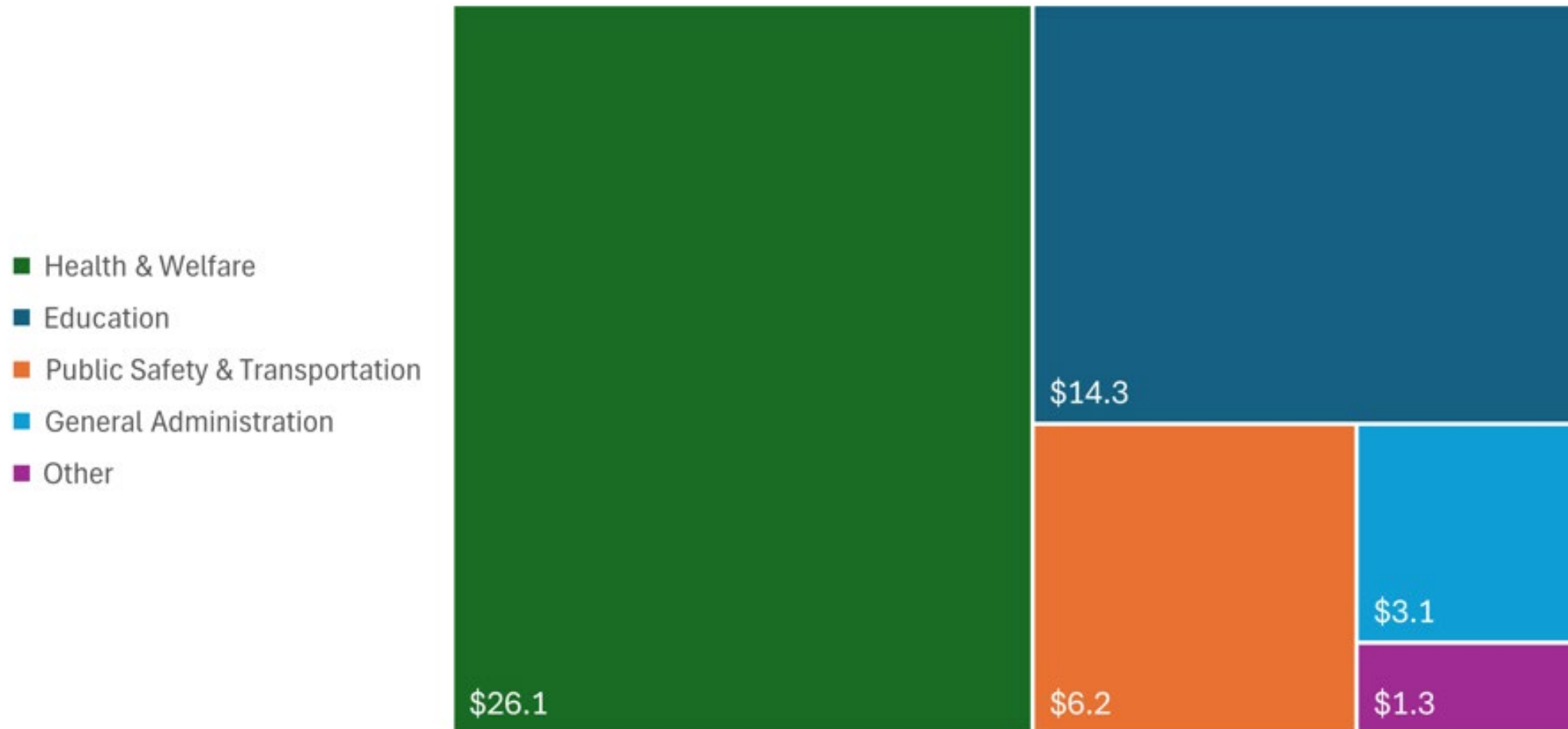


Services Delivered for Every Indiana Tax Dollar (FY2024)



Total Expenses for Indiana (FY2024)

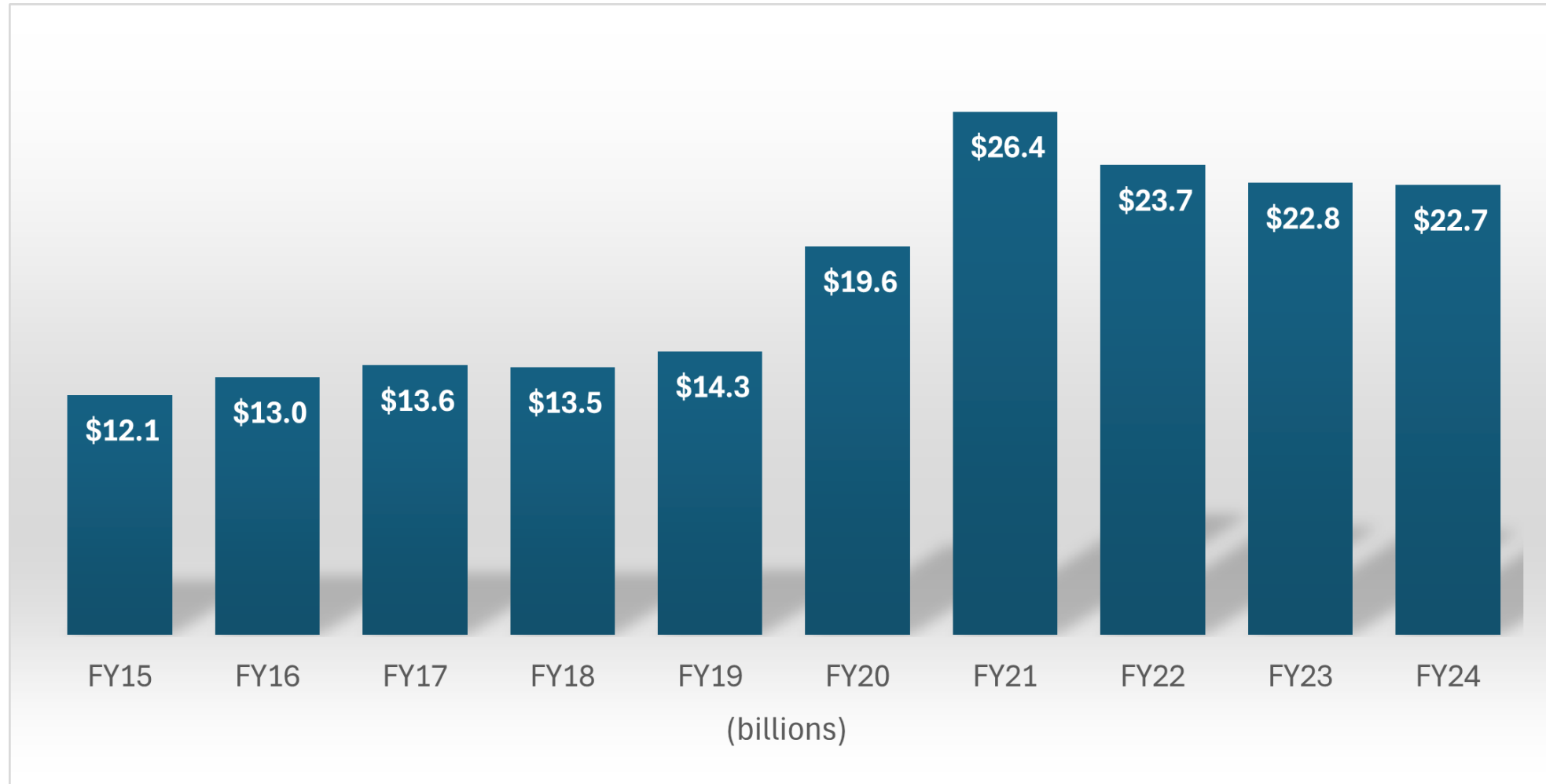
Expenses by Program: Total \$51.0 Billion



Total State Revenue & Expenses

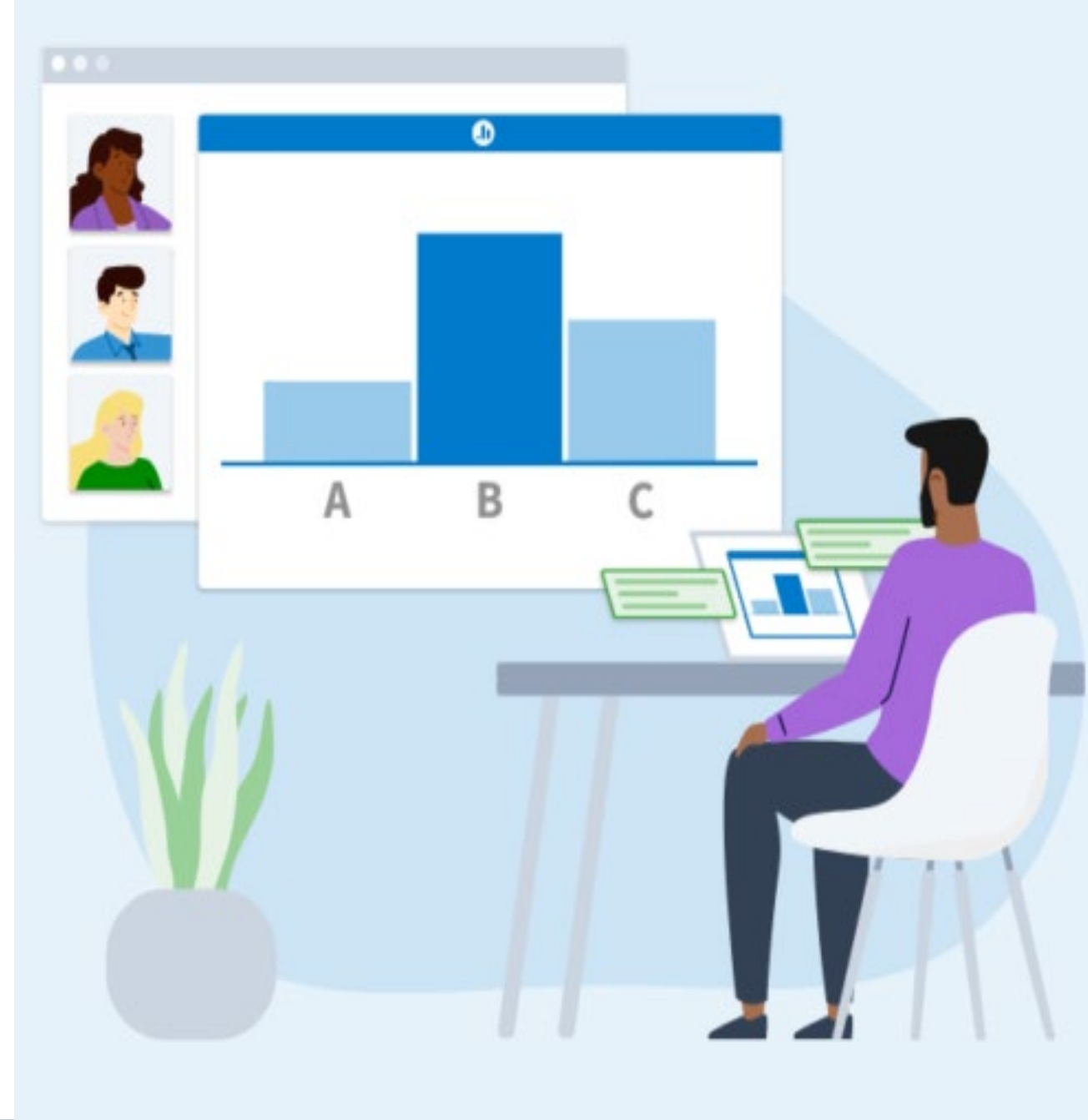


Federal Grant Expenditures

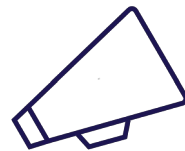

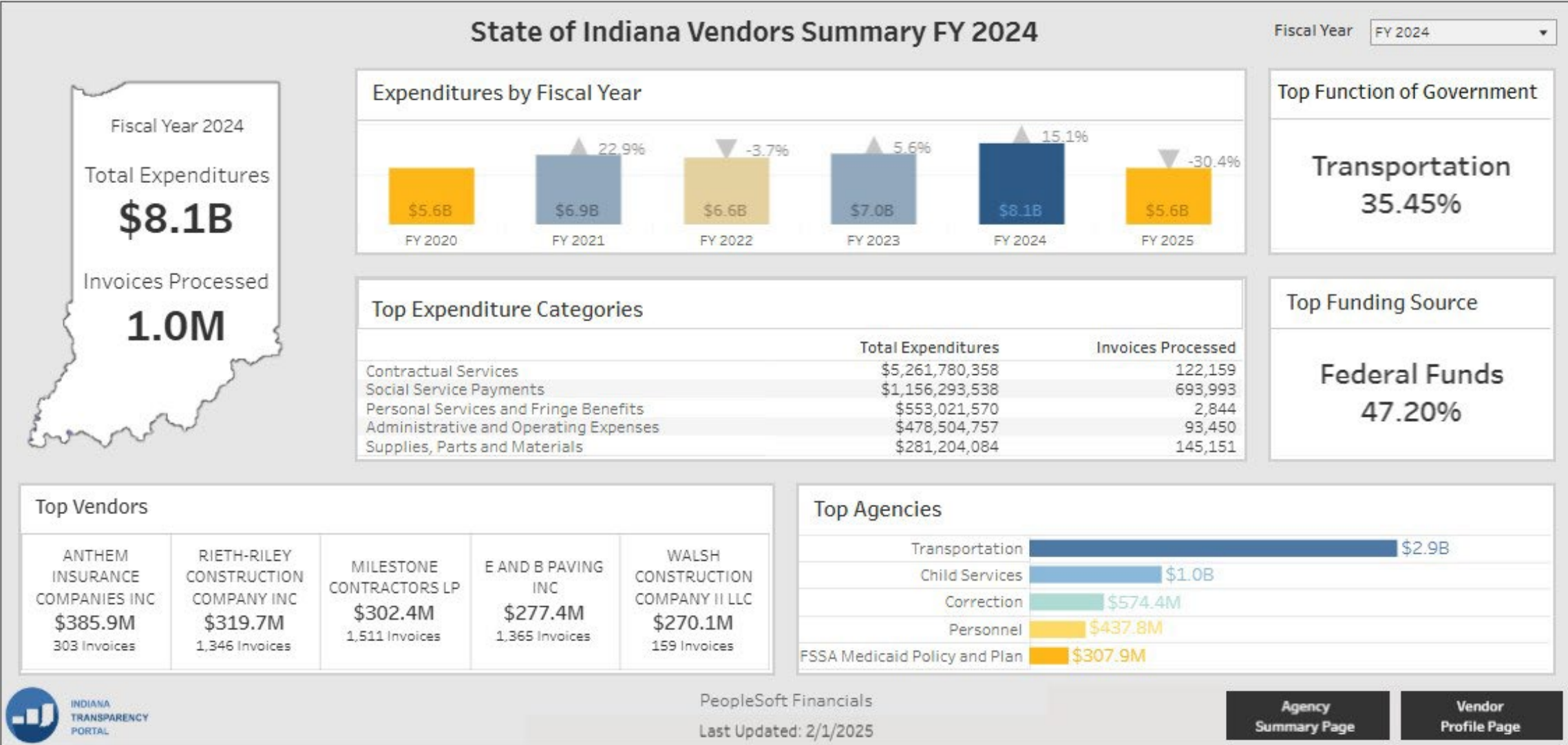

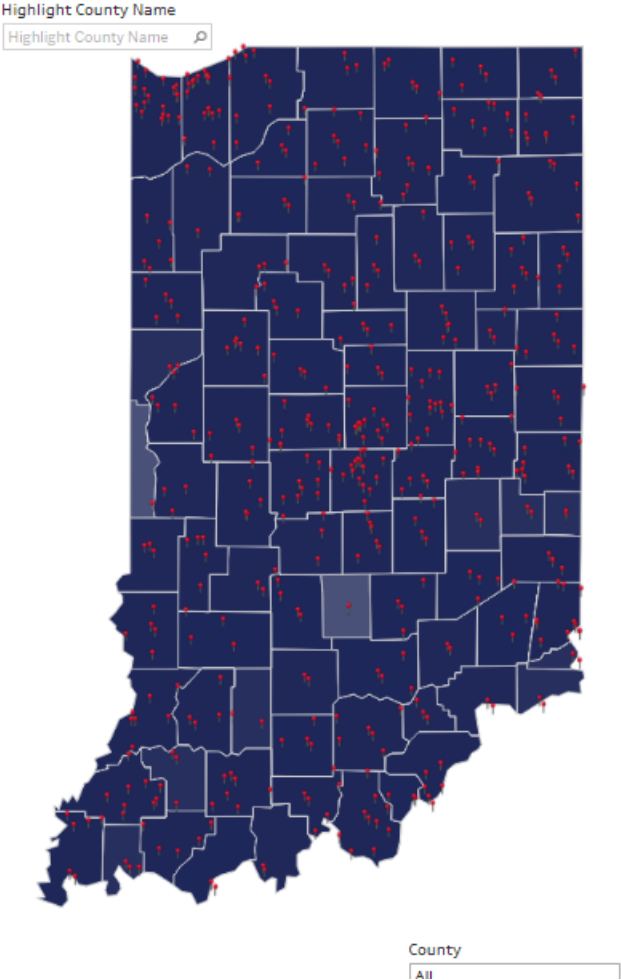

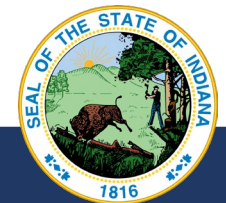
NATIONAL DEBT CRISIS



National Debt Crisis

Indiana provides a meaningful model of fiscal responsibility

- A long-term plan is needed to restore America's financial solvency
- National Debt is \$36 trillion and over \$100,000 per capita
- Interest alone exceeds the annual budgets for the U.S. Military (\$820B) and Medicare (\$839B)
- Leading the National Debt Crisis Taskforce for state financial officers supporting Congress and our President to:
 - 1) Spend less in 2025 than was spent in 2024
 - 2) Create a path to a balanced budget as soon as possible
 - 3) Unleash economic growth, become energy dominant and institute a timeline for reducing the debt empowered by additional tax revenue
