

**CASS COUNTY COMMISSIONERS**  
**NOVEMBER 4, 2013**

The Cass County Commissioners met Monday at 1:00 p.m. in the Commissioner Hearing Room. Present were Dave Arnold, Jim Sailors, Ralph Anderson, Attorney John Hillis and Auditor Vaneen Ide. Dave Arnold opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance, followed by a moment of silence.

**MINUTES**

Ralph Anderson made a motion to approve the minutes as presented, Jim Sailors seconded. The motion carried unanimously.

**CLAIMS & PAYROLL**

Jim Sailors made a motion to approve the claims and payroll as presented, Ralph Anderson seconded. The motion carried unanimously.

**HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT**

Jeff Smith appeared before the Commissioners with his monthly update of the CCHD. Jeff reported that work on the 2013 road program is nearly finished, with the application of 3.4 miles of hot mix asphalt in late October. Nearly 44 road miles received treatment during this year's program. Pavement markings were applied to almost 14 miles of roadway. The Cliff Drive culvert project is complete and the road reopened to traffic on October 11<sup>th</sup>. Relinquishment was finalized as of the day of the Hoosier Heartland opening, Old State Road 25 will now be a county road, while Burlington Avenue reverts back to the state control. Cass County also gains three bridge structures while giving three back to state control. A fourth bridge on Market Street over the Eel River will be turned over to Cass County after it is replaced in two to three years.

Ray Eber appeared and gave the Commissioners the update on CCHD projects. A concrete box culvert on 200S near 175W was replaced with an aluminum one. A work crew led by Ron Blackman and workers Chuck Sterrett, Jim Buettner, Rob Spradling, Tristan Whitcomb and Kevin Cowell, cleared heavy debris and brush on the banks for this culvert to be installed. The CCHD is very pleased with this job. The culvert replacement scheduled for Delaware road will not be able to be done this year. A hydraulic study was commissioned and after the study, recommendations called for a larger pipe, which will have to be ordered. Ralph Anderson asked Ray Eber if something could be done to help with the water flow until the project can be completed. Ray thought that the pipe could be opened up, and debris cleared as a temporary fix.

**PARK DEPARTMENT**

Lucas Beach appeared before the Commissioners with his monthly Park Department report. The DINO series did a trail run at the park, they had a 5k and 15k run. There were 168 participants, it was the hardest trail run of the series and had great comments from every racer. The Park hosted Sleepy

Hollow haunted hay ride the last two weekends of the month in October. The ride was from 7:30 to 11:30 at night, there were 8 spooky scenes set up along the path. In 2012, 600 people attended the hay ride. This year the park had 1606 people attend. On the 26<sup>th</sup> of October the Park held its first Zombie Run. It was a 5k and there were 75 runners and 25 zombies. Demolition of the beach bathroom has begun. The Park will be utilizing many of the fixtures in the bath house to save on cost.

#### **HEALTH DEPARTMENT**

Bob Vernon appeared before the Commissioners with the Health Department report. The Health department saw a total of 218 patients giving them 645 vaccinations. Nurses conducted two adult flu shot clinics seeing 143 adults and giving 143 flu shots, 86 children also received flu shots. Eric Eldridge has been teaching the new environmentalist, Tom Clear, many things. Both Eric and Tom attended a hands on training in Miami County for Onsite Sewage System training hosted by the State. Jan McKaig continues teaching hand washing to the elementary students. Jan is also assisting with duties of the front desk and vital records. Bob attended a Vital Records Conference with Juana and now will be able to assist with vital records. The office is running very well and everyone is working together as a team and the intention is to bring the Health Department to a higher standard and serve the public in a professional manner.

Precinct 8 in district three moved to district two. This evened out the voters to be within the range that the State of Indiana requires. Voters will be notified after this is presented to the Cass County Council at their November 15<sup>th</sup> meeting. Ralph Anderson made a motion to approve the changes as presented, Jim Sailors seconded. The motion carried unanimously.

#### **PUBLIC COMMENTS & ADJOURN**



Dave Arnold informed all that County Councilmember; Jeff LeDonne suffered a heart attack and had surgery today. Jeff was doing well.


Dave Arnold introduced Christy Householder as the new Economic Development Director for Cass County.


Ralph Anderson made a motion to adjourn, Jim Sailors seconded. The motion carried unanimously.
