

**CLARK COUNTY ELECTION BOARD  
MINUTES OF MEETING  
MARCH 31, 2025**

A meeting of the Clark County Election Board was held at the Clark County Courthouse, Voter Registration Office, 501 East Court Avenue, Jeffersonville, Indiana, on March 31, 2025.


The following Board Members were present: Democratic Representative and President, Andrew Steele; Republican Representative and Vice Chairman Tony Singleton, and Clark County Clerk, Ryan Lynch. Also present were Piper Mathis and Angela Cornett, Voter Registration employees, and JoAnn Geoghegan, Secretary of Minutes. Members of the public present were Teresa Ballew, Nancy McDevitt, Kelly Khuri, Alice Butler, Judy Robertson, Rick Robertson, Benita Pate, Susan Popp, John Croucher and Christina Kelty. Andrew Steele called the meeting to order at 4:49 p.m.

The first matter before the Board is Old Business. The Board advises that they have received information on the campaign financial complaint and incorporates it into the Minutes. Ryan Lynch presents the information to the members of the public and provides a copy for them. After review, Alice Butler addresses the Board regarding the information provided as she still has unanswered on the paperwork that was provided. Andrew Steele makes note of the issues of contention presented. Ms. Butler also inquires as to the McVoy information including taxes, 1099, expenses, and whether the expenses were included in the documentation. She also requests more information on MDL Strategies and the issue of compensation for the campaign staff and the employees of the mayor. Ms. Butler also suggests implementing a spreadsheet for the financial reports filed by the candidates for better accountability of the filings. Andrew Steele advises the Board will leave the issue open for the public to see if there is anything else they want to respond to or request.


The next matter before the Board is New Business. Early voting begins April 8, 2025 at the Courthouse from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. The only issue on the ballot is the Silver Creek School Board election. There are approximately 13,000 eligible voters for this election. The last matter before the Board is the audit with VSTOP. Clark County is voluntarily participating in the audit for the upcoming special election. The Board answers questions from the public regarding the audit.

There being nothing further before the Board, Tony Singleton makes a motion to adjourn. Seconded by Andrew Steele. Carried 3-0. The next regular meeting will be April 28, 2025 at 4:45 p.m. with public testing taking place on April 3, 2025. Meeting adjourned at 5:42 p.m.


