AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE 030195 AND ORDINANCE 030195B, ESTABLISHING STANDARDS AND CONDITIONS FOR THE ISSUANCE OF PERMITS TO USE PUBLIC WAYS AND RIGHTS-OF-WAY UNDER THE JURISDICTION OF CRAWFORD COUNTY;

WHEREAS, Ind. Code § 9-21-1-2 conveys upon Crawford County Board of Commissioners the power to adopt by Ordinance traffic regulations with respect to highways under its jurisdiction;

WHEREAS, various modifications, corrections, and changes need to be made to Ordinances 030195 and 030195B pertaining to traffic regulations previously adopted by Crawford County.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained, by Crawford County, Indiana, as follows:

The Language of Ordinances 030195 and 030195B is repealed and the following language is adopted:


- I. Between February 1 and May 1 of any calendar year; it shall be unlawful to operate any vehicle in excess of 26,000 gross vehicle weight or gross vehicle weight rating; except as permitted by special weight registration decals issued by the Crawford County Highway Department.
- II. The Crawford County Highway Department has the power to permit the operation of overweight vehicles through the issuance of permit decals.
- III. As determined by the Crawford County Highway Department; a surety bond may be required to protect the interests of the Citizens of Crawford County, Indiana.
- IV. The denial of any permit, or the requirement of any bond posting, may be appealed to the Crawford County Board of Commissioners.
- V. There shall be no fee for these permits.
- VI. These permits expire December 31 of the year of issuance; and should be renewed annually.
- VII. Any person found to be in violation of this ordinance could be subject to a fine of not more than \$500.00; and/or the cost of repairs for damage to County infrastructure.
- VIII. This ordinance shall exempt any vehicle owned by a unit of government, emergency vehicles, and any implement of agriculture for the transport, delivery, application or harvesting of crops, seed, fertilizer, crop protection products, and livestock; and deliveries to local businesses or repair facilities.


