A discussion of the federally financed program of the Car Pooling Project Policy Group, which Group is preparing a study of the traffic movement in the Counties of Jefferson, Oldham and Bullit in the Commonwealth of Kentucky, and the Counties of Floyd and Clark in the State of Indiana, with the objective of determining whether or not a feasible car pooling plan could be formulated to increase the use of car pools in the counties with an objective of also assisting in the natural energy conserving movement, was had.

After the discussion and it being thoroughly established that Floyd County, Indiana would incur no expense whatsoever by joining in and supporting the Car Pooling Project Policy Group, Francis J. Loftus offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

RESOLVED, that Floyd County, Indiana, acting by and through its Board of County Commissioners, become a member of the federally financed Car Pooling Project Policy Group and to lend its full and complete support toward the attainment and fulfillment of the goals for which Car Pooling Project Policy Group is created.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that no expenses be incurred and no money expended by virtue of the adoption of this resolution and that any and all cooperation, encouragement and assistance rendered to said Car Pooling Project Policy Group shall be such as will not, either directly or indirectly, create any financial obligation on the part of Floyd County, Indiana.

Upon said resolution being seconded by Vincent H. Freiberger and submitted to vote, the same was unanimously adopted.
