

**HOWARD COUNTY COUNCIL REGULAR AND 2007 BUDGET MEETINGS AUGUST 22, 23, 24,
AND SEPTEMBER 6, 2006**

The Howard County Council met Tuesday, August 22, 2006 at 7:00 p.m., in Room 338 of the Howard County Administration Center. Those present included Council President Richard H. Miller, Council Vice President James Papacek, Council Members Jeffrey A. Stout, Leslie W. Ellison, Dwight Singer, Jr., Stanley Ortman, and Joseph A. Pencek. Also in attendance were Attorney Larry Murrell and Auditor Ann Wells. At the conclusion of the regular business of the Council, the meeting will be recessed, instead of adjourned, in order to carry out the budget request process for budget year 2007.

The meeting was called to order by Sheriff Talbert and conducted by President Richard Miller.

IN THE MATTER OF THE APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

The minutes of the July 25, 2006 meeting, having been previously submitted and reviewed, were approved on a motion made by Mr. Papacek and seconded by Mr. Stout.

IN THE MATTER OF MAINTENANCE DEPARTMENT ISSUES:

Buildings & Grounds Supervisor Art Fross reported to the Council concerning the opening of the bids for the Administration Center HVAC Project. The bids were opened at the August 21, 2006 Commissioner Meeting with the bid from Benchmark Mechanical, at \$235,837.00, being accepted as the lowest and most responsive and responsible bid (*please refer to page one and page two, item three, "In The Matter Of Maintenance Department Issues", of the Commissioner*

Regular Meeting minutes dated August 21, 2006). The boilers for this project have been ordered and, including the heating side of the project, a total savings of \$256,000.00 will be realized.

IN THE MATTER OF THE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT FEASIBILITY STUDY:

Mr. Paul Wyman addressed the Council, reminding them of the August 30th meeting for the Economic Development Feasibility Study. All Council Members are invited to meet with the consultant for "further discussion on how we're spending our economic dollars". Individual conferences can also be arranged. On behalf of the United Way Organization, Mr. Wyman thanked the Council for their permission to use County grounds and personnel during "The Taste of Kokomo" festival.

IN THE MATTER OF CIRCUIT COURT AND THE IDHS GRANT:

Circuit Court Judge Lynn Murray and Superior Court IV Judge George Hopkins presented a request to pursue an Indiana Department of Homeland Security Grant available for the purchase of equipment, only, to enhance court security. This grant is reimbursable and is distributed on a first come, first served basis. The amount can be up to \$50,000.00 with a possibility of additional funds upon review. All work and purchases need to be completed after sub grant agreement is executed and before October 31, 2006. With extensive input by Sheriff Talbert, the Judges decided to pursue the purchase of an X-Ray Unit (Baggage Scanners) and Magnetometers (wands and portals) if funds are granted, to be installed at the east entrance of the Courthouse. Judge Murray understands that this equipment would require additional personnel, but even if additional personnel was not available in the near future, being able to run the equipment during the times when the Courthouse has "high profile" trials would be of considerable benefit. There would already be extra personnel on hand during those times. At the conclusion of ensuing discussion, a motion was made by Mr. Singer, seconded by Mr. Ortman and carried to authorize Judge Murray, along with the other remaining Judges and Sheriff Talbert, to pursue the IDHS Grant.

IN THE MATTER OF SHERIFF DEPARTMENT ISSUES:

Sheriff Marshall Talbert presented the following issues for Council information:

1. **Department Of Corrections Checks:** Sheriff Talbert presented two reimbursement checks to the Auditor in the amounts of \$15,750.00 and \$11,515.00.
2. **Canine Purchase Funds:** The Local Coordinating Council has approved a grant from the Mayor's Community Based Drug Free Program to the Sheriff's Department of \$3,200.00 for the purchase of an additional canine, only. Prosecutor Fleming has given \$10,000.00 from the Law Enforcement Fund toward the Canine Purchase and other related purchases. This Canine will remain on the midnight shift.

IN THE MATTER OF PERSONNEL ISSUES:

Personnel Director Wanda McKillip presented the following issues for Council information:

1. **Howard County Employee Data Report:** This annual report was distributed with the 2006/2007 Budget Book for Council information.
2. **Exempt and Non-exempt Status Listing:** This report lists each employment position and identifies them as Exempt or Non-exempt. She noted the change in position title and exempt status for E-911 Coordinator (145). The Personnel Office is currently working on employee job descriptions; there may be other changes in the future. Ms. McKillip also included information concerning the Factor Evaluation System (FES), a job categorization system. Ms. McKillip made a recommendation to the Council to form a Wage Committee to determine how Howard County should set salaries in the future. Points to consider would be education, longevity, skills, knowledge and responsibilities. She would suggest the committee include of three Council members, one Commissioner, the Auditor and Personnel Director, and whomever the Council deems appropriate. It was the consensus of the Council to address this issue in the near future.
3. **Consistent Medical Claims:** Ms. McKillip reported that medical claims for the current year have been consistent. She is hopeful that premium rates and benefit rates can be maintained for the future.

There being no further business to come before the Council at this time, the meeting was recessed until 8:30 a.m., August 23, 2006, on a motion made by Mr. Papacek and seconded by Mr. Singer.

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The meeting was reopened on Wednesday, August 23, 2006, by President Richard Miller.

Auditor Ann Wells informed the Council that on April 28, 2006, she had asked her staff to stop writing checks from County General because funds were too low to support payroll and accounts payable. Today, September 6th, she again directed her financial staff to stop writing accounts payable checks out of County General until the advanced draw was received.

Commissioner Brad Bagwell informed the Council of the need to relocate or rebuild the present E-911 tower, due to a problem of losing connections during storms. Money has been spent on repairs, replacements and studies to determine the cause, but the problems have not been fixed. Mr. Bagwell has been working on negotiations for leasing space at a different location settling on an amount of \$80,000.00 that includes the actual leasing price, relocation of equipment, additional equipment and concrete pad. Also presented was the option of building our own tower, about a six month process, at a cost of about \$180,000.00. The cost will be greater, but the tower would meet our specifications, be located close to the dispatch area and have space to lease to other entities. Discussion and a time of question and answer ensued.

A motion was made by Mr. Singer to approve the appropriation request of \$80,000.00 to Cumulative Capital 03000.00, Other Services & Charges, and to authorize the Board of Commissioners to proceed with arrangements to build a new tower. The motion was seconded by Mr. Stout and carried.

The 2007 Budget Hearing is now reconvened.

IN THE MATTER OF OPENING REMARKS BY PRESIDENT MILLER:

Mr. Miller offered the following comments to the Council in preparation of setting the budget for the year 2007, item by item:

- 1) This is a "sizable task", but feels that it is crucial to preserve funds to offer a salary and wage increase to employees.
- 2) Auditor Wells' report that the actual cash fund is so low she has suspended the payment of claims until an advanced draw is received, comes at an inconvenient time. He does not remember that being a concern during his years on the Council.
- 3) At Ms. Well's request, Mr. Miller clarified that a proposed salary increase would be for full time salary and hourly workers; it would not apply to increasing part time monies.
- 4) The total amount of the 2007 Budget Request is \$24,580,060.00. That amount needs to be \$22,500,000.00. The Council has the task of finding where to cut \$2,080,060.00 from the requested budget.
- 5) Edit monies have been offered to help pay Insurance and PERF, freeing up as much as \$500,000.00 in the County General Fund to underwrite an employee raise.

Discussion ensued concerning a wage increase. It was the consensus of the Council, that preserving funds to offer a salary and wage increase is a top priority. The Council continued the meeting, progressing by department, to set the 2007 budget. Results of the budget process are available on the Budget Worksheet in the Auditor's Office.

At the conclusion of the budget process, discussion ensued concerning employee salary increases. On a motion made by Mr. Papacek and seconded by Mr. Singer, Mr. Stout, Mr. Ellison, Mr. Pencek and Mr. Ortman, the Howard County Employees were budgeted a three per cent salary increase.

A motion was made by Mr. Papacek, seconded by all present Council Members, and carried to approve the 2007 Budget as amended.

Council Member Dwight Singer took the opportunity to remind those in attendance that this budget hearing is his last official hearing as a Council Member. He expressed his gratitude and appreciation to Council Members present, past, and

near future, for their hard work and the fine job they have done. He commended County Attorney Larry Murrell for all he has done for Howard County since joining the County on a full time basis.
Mr. Singer will be missed.

There being no further business to come before the Council at this time, the 2007 Budget Hearings were adjourned at 9:59 p.m. on a motion made by Mr. Papacek and seconded by Mr. Pencek.
