# IN THE MATTER OF DEPARTMENTAL BUSINESS & REPORTS:

#### WORK RELEASE

#### Bathroom Remodel

Assistant Chief Probation Officer Jeremie Lovall requested funds for a remodel at the Work Release building that is not ADA compliant. Commissioner Lipinski made a motion for Community Corrections to pay half and for the Maintenance Department to pay half of the necessary building repairs to make it ADA compliant. #### **TREASURER**

L&D Mail Masters Service Agreement

Treasurer Christie Branch presented the contract from L&D Mail Masters for our annual service agreement renewal. L&D mails out all of our tax documents and bills to the residences of Howard County. Commissioner Lipinski made a motion to approve the contract. Commissioner Bray seconded the motion, and the motion carried.

#### **MAINTENCE**

#### Dispatch Carpeting

Maintenance Supervisor Bill Stonestreet requested permission to replace the carpeting in the dispatch area at a cost of \$9,125.00. Commissioner Lipinski made a motion to approve this project. Commissioner Bray seconded the motion, and the motion carried.

# IN THE MATTER OF NEW BUSINESS:

Highway Superintendent Amber Tolle read into record the Commissioners have agreed to match 1.5 million dollars as their portion of the Community Crossings Matching Grant that will total \$3 million dollars from the state.

# IN THE MATTER OF CLAIMS AND REPORTS:

# IN THE MATTER OF COUNTY ATTORNEY ISSUES:

# Purchase of Real Estate

County Attorney Alan Wilson requested a resolution number and approval of the purchase of property at the address of 2200 W. Markland Avenue, where we will be building the new jail. Auditor Jessica Secrease provided him with the resolution number 2025-HCCR-03. Commissioner Lipinski made a motion to approve the purchase of this property. Commissioner Bray seconded the motion, and the motion carried.

#### Property Clean up

County Attorney Alan Wilson wanted to just give an update on the Stevens property on Hickory Lane. It has been ordered by the court for the property to be cleaned up. There is another hearing on who will be responsible for the clean up and who is going to be responsible for paying for it. Mr. Wilson is in fear that it will fall on the Commissioner's lap and it will cost anywhere from \$60,000.00 to 100,000.00 to hire someone to clean it out. He just wanted to make the Commissioners aware of the situation.

There being no further business to come before the Board of Commissioners at this time the meeting was adjourned at 4:19 p.m. on a motion made by Commissioner Lipinski.
