

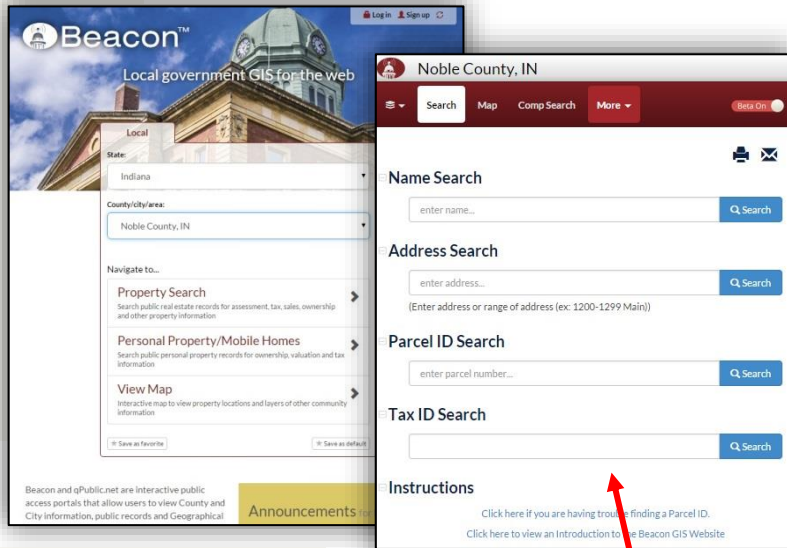

Toggle on and off the Layers and Quick Links sidebar.

Use this menu bar to control display of layers, view the map, perform a search or a comparable search.

Perform searches by name, address, parcel ID or Tax ID. These numbers are found on your tax statement.



Use the search box to search quickly by property owner name or address.

Use the tool bar to interactively work with the map: identify a map feature, zoom in or out, pan, zoom back to full extents, zoom interactively, measure a map feature, perform a spatial selection, clear selected map features, change the map size, print, or change the map scale.

Turn layers on or off by checking them. Click a layer's name to set it as the layer to perform queries on. The "I" symbol will show up on the right of the name.

Use the "Toggle Map Size" button to enlarge map window to entire screen.

Beacon features include:

- Use the Search tab to add search criteria for searching by name, address, state 18-digit key parcel number, or Auditor's tax ID number.
- An Info panel along the right-hand side of the map displays county office contact information and information for selected features appearing on the map.
- Layers automatically turn on when selected. This option can be disabled using the Options button.
- The user interface includes tabbed screens, improving navigation. Tabs provide quick access to the map window, the search window, the window showing the results of a search, the report window, and both the comparables search and comparables results windows.
- Two parcel layers exist. The Parcels (Assessor) layer provides property assessment information from the Assessor's Office and limited tax information, transfer history, exemptions, and homestead allocations from the Auditor's Office. The Parcels (Surveyor) layer provides property land ownership and drainage information from the Surveyor's Office.
- View Surveyor's Office scanned tie card PDF documents by selecting a section corner feature found on the Control Points layer.
- The comparable search is a great feature providing the ability to search for certain category criteria of a feature. If you already have a parcel feature selected on the map, its values will be populated in red on the right side of the comparables search. Different categories are available along with a check box to enable the category in a search. The comparables search is only available when using the Parcels (Assessor) layer.
- The Report tab provides customizable report options.
- There is an Options screen for controlling the map size (three screen resolution sizes are available depending on the size of your screen), map print size, and turning on or off the auto-refresh map layer option.
- A built-in help system provides information for performing common tasks.
- An overview map is shown to show your position within the county when zoomed into an area of interest.
- Use the Feedback screen to provide the county feedback on your use of the site.
- View the Assessor's Property Record Card in PDF format located at the bottom of the Report Tab. Note: Property Record Cards are available only for existing property as of March 1st of the current tax cycle.
- View 51 of the counties mappable cemetery sites on the Cemeteries layer.
- View 71 Historical Marker location sites placed by the Noble County Historical Society. Historical marker signs identify historic sites in Noble County. Visit the Noble County Historical Society's website for more information.
- View Drug Enforcement and Sex Offender Enforcement boundaries for the entire county.
- Three County Orthoimagery flights available for 2003, 2017, and 2021.
- As of July 1, 2015, please be aware that some property information may be unavailable on Beacon per IC 36-1-8.5.

Updated in 2022, IndianaMap.org is the public source for map data in Indiana. It includes geospatial information people need most in various formats that is accessible to both the general public and expert geographic information systems (GIS) users.

Noble County's GIS History

Noble County's GIS system has been a dynamic evolving entity over the last three decades. The Surveyor's Office envisioned the need for a GIS and later became the driving force behind an Enterprise GIS. Starting in the mid 1980's, the Surveyor's Office began work towards a GIS for internal use. The vision for a GIS culminated in the creation of a county-wide digital tax map by the late 1990's. The digital tax map was maintained with additional layers added. In 2003, the County Commissioners appropriated funds for the creation of an Enterprise GIS to promote Economic Develop. In 2003, the GIS project was launched with purchase of digital orthophotography and various planimetric layers (e.g., 2 ft. contours, building outlines, road centerlines, and railroads). During 2004 and into the early part of 2005, the majority of the GIS layers were created. By March 2005, the GIS was supporting Phase II enhanced 9-1-1. Additional orthophotography datasets were obtained in 2005 (having 1 ft pixel resolution) and in 2008 (having 6.75 inch pixel resolution). Work continues today with ArcGIS Server for creating customized web mapping applications in Microsoft Silverlight.

Below is a summary of the major milestones in Noble County GIS development:

- **2014/2017/2020/2021:** New County Pictometry ortho/oblique imagery flown in April '14, May and Nov. '17, April '20 and April '21.
- **2012:** New county aerials purchased through the State of Indiana in March.
- **2009-2012:** County works on custom web application development using ArcGIS Server and Silverlight.
- **2008:** County contracts with Pictometry to produce 6.75 inch color orthophotography and oblique photography.
- **2007:** Beacon GIS website made available.
- **2005:** County receives 1 foot resolution color orthophotography from state.
- **2003:** County contracts with the Schneider Corporation (GIS/E-911 project); County contracts with Sanborn to produce 6 inch color orthophotography and planimetric features.
- **1990's:** Surveyor's Office continues mapping county into a digital environment using AutoCAD.
- **1980's:** Surveyor's Office compiles deeds, calculates section corner coordinates; begins tax mapping duties.
