# COUNTY COUNCIL June 12th, 2025

- I. CALL TO ORDER: The Parke County Council convened in a regular meeting on Thursday, June 12th, 2025 to consider additional requests in excess of the budget allowed for 2025, and to conduct such other business as may be properly brought before the Council.
- II. ROLL CALL: Council members present were Roy Wrightsman, President; Thomas Rohr, Vice President; Jack B. Butler; James E. Howard; Rick Patton; Mary Alice Gregg; Matt Helderman, Susan Kramer, Auditor. Also present were Katie Potter, Kim Shorter, Leanna Collisi, Jim Meece Jessica Lancaster, Jason Frazier, Stacie Amerman and Mandy Adams Washburn.
- III. READING OF THE MINUTES: Minutes for the Council Meeting held on May 8th, 2025 were presented. Jack B Butler made a motion to approve the May 8th, 2025 minutes as presented. Rick Patton seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.
- IV. ADDITIONAL APPROPRIATION REQUESTS: The Council considered additional appropriation requests as published in the newspaper May 28th, 2025.

Council President, Roy Wrightsman, reviewed the appropriations from written requests submitted by Auditor, Susan Kramer Thus, the following ordinance was adopted: WHEREAS: it has been determined it is now necessary to appropriate more money than was appropriated in the annual budget for 2025, BE IT ORDAINED, by the County Council of Parke County, Indiana, for the expenses of said County government, the following additional sums of money are hereby appropriated and ordered set out of the funds herein specified, subject to the law governing the same: Thomas Rohr made a motion to approve the additional appropriation requests as advertised on May 28th, 2025. ## Roy Wrightsman – County Council President

- O Informed Council members of upcoming State Board of Accounts County Council Annual Conference to be held on June 21,2025. Anyone wishing to attend should contact the Auditor.
- O Discussed an article in the Tribune Star, part of the State's 2025 budget bill prohibits funding to community mental health providers with employees receiving more than \$400,000 a year. Public records indicate Hamilton Center CEO is currently making more than twice that limit. This needs to be monitored closely.

**Redevelopment Commission (RDC):** TIF Hearing no excess AV. Purchase agreement for the bank building has been extended until June 30<sup>th</sup>, 2025. Revolving loan request was held for additional information from the requester.

Courthouse Security Committee: Reviewed courthouse security plan, a safety drill will occur at a later date.

Planning and Zoning Board: Did not meet.

West Central Solid Waste District (SWD): Electronic Recycle day is June 14th, 2025, illegal dumping continues at Scott Pets Recycle area.

Northern Parke Regional Sewer District: First official meeting was held June 11<sup>th</sup>, 2025 to elect officers, there is no funding so at this time no additional progress will be made.

  - o 4th round of cyclical reassessments are currently being performed.
  - o Form 11's had been sent out to taxpayers, appeals are starting to come in.
  - O Will be accepting sealed bids for a contractor to perform cyclical reassessments of real property for property tax purposes.

- o Enterprise Fleet Management working on a quote
- O Continue to have temperature issues with the Court Room and the Judges' office, Johnson Controls states that it is an exhaust sensor not the new chiller, parts are on order.
- o Matt Stechley is obtaining quotes for repairs and/or replacement.
- o Melcher Bridge work will begin soon Collom Excavating has moved equipment in, abutment should be poured soon
