

To file for divorce in Indiana, you generally need to:

1. **Meet Residency Requirements:** At least one spouse must have lived in Indiana for at least 6 months and in the county where you file for at least 3 months.
2. **File a Petition:** You must file a Petition for Dissolution of Marriage with the court. Forms and instructions are available from the Indiana Courts Self-Service Legal Center.
3. **Wait for the Court Process:** There is a minimum 60-day waiting period after filing before the court can finalize the divorce.
4. **Address Key Issues:** The court will address child custody, child support, spousal maintenance, and property division. If you and your spouse agree on these, your agreement can be included in the divorce decree.
5. **Court Appearance:** You may be required to appear in court.
