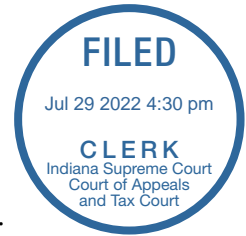

Order Appointing and Reappointing Members to the Coalition for Court Access

The Coalition for Court Access acts as a legal aid organization that develops and implements a statewide plan to improve the availability and quality of access to civil legal services for persons of limited means. The Supreme Court appoints members to the Coalition from areas of practice and the bar pursuant to Indiana Rule of Professional Conduct 6.6(b).

The terms of John Floreancig, CEO and General Counsel, Indianapolis Legal Aid Society and Scott Wylie, Executive Director, Pro Bono Indiana have expired. John Floreancig and Scott Wylie served two terms as the Court's civil legal assistance organization and pro bono organization appointments, respectively. The Court thanks them for their dedication and service.

To replace John Floreancig, the Court appoints Kerry Hyatt Bennett, Legal Counsel, Indiana Coalition Against Domestic Violence; and to replace Scott Wylie, the Court appoints Jean Blanton, partner at Zimmer Stayman Weitzel and Shoulders and member and former chairperson of the Evansville Bar Association's Access to Justice Committee. Kerry Hyatt Bennett and Jean Blanton shall serve until June 30, 2025, or when a successor is appointed.

The Court reappoints to the Coalition the Honorable Geoffrey Slaughter, Associate Justice, Indiana Supreme Court; Charles Dunlap, Executive Director, Indiana Bar Foundation; the Honorable Melissa S. May, Judge, Indiana Court of Appeals; Professor Victor Quintanilla, Indiana University Maurer School of Law; Joe Skeel, Executive Director, Indiana State Bar Association; and Michael Tolbert, Partner, Tolbert & Tolbert, LLC. These members shall serve until June 30, 2024, or when a successor is appointed.

The Court also reappoints to the Coalition the Honorable Charles K. Todd, Jr., Wayne Superior 1. Judge Todd shall serve until June 30, 2025, or when a successor is appointed.
