What is RBH?

RBH service provides training to regain skills that were lost secondary to the traumatic brain injury (TBI).

RBH will provide goal-oriented training and demonstration with:

- Skills related to activities of daily living, such as personal grooming, bed making and household chores, planning meals and preparing food
- Skills related to living in the community, such as using the telephone, learning to prepare and maintaining calendars of essential dates/activities, handling money and paying bills, shopping and errands and accessing public transportation

What is needed to provide RBH?

Habilitation services must be performed by persons who are supervised by:

- Certified brain injury specialist (CBIS)
- Qualified intellectual disability professional (QIDP)
- Physical, occupational, or speech therapist licensed by the state of Indiana who has completed training or has experience in conducting habilitation programs

Please note that you will be required to have staff hired at the time of certification, and the appropriate licensures of staff will be required to be uploaded.
