- **Introduction of session and new member** ○ Eric Miller opened the meeting, welcoming the Working Group members and sharing the meeting objectives
    - Camille Svendsen (BCBA) introduced herself as an ABA provider of 10 years practicing in southern Indiana
  - **Discussion of quality & outcomes** ○ Tara Morse presented materials on Indiana current state, comparison to national standard, and potential levers for consideration
    - Working Group members discussed potential levers:
      - Supported improving how ABA service quality is measured, including tracking outcomes and enhancing session documentation
      - Broad interest in increasing oversight
      - Emphasized the importance of defining progress clearly and fairly, particularly for children with more complex needs or slower developmental trajectories
  - **Discussion of utilization** ○ Katrina Etter presented materials on Indiana current state, comparison to national standard, and potential levers for consideration
    - Working Group members discussed potential levers:
      - Emphasized need for clearly defined, standard, and member-centric criteria
      - Highlighted need to improve how care transitions (e.g., school reentry) are managed and tracked
  - **Discussion of eligibility** ○ Eric presented materials on Indiana current state, comparison to national standard, and potential levers for consideration
    - Working Group members discussed potential levers:
      - Emphasized the need for accessible, and ethically sound diagnostic pathways, including reducing reliance on any single diagnostic tool
