What is PEST?

PEST services are designed to prevent, suppress, or eradicate anything that competes with humans for food and water, injures humans, spreads disease to humans, or annoys humans, and is causing or is expected to cause more harm than is reasonable to accept. Pests include but are not limited to roaches, mosquitoes, bed bugs, fleas, mites, ticks, rats, mice, etc.

PEST has an annual cap of \$4,000.

What is needed to provide pest?

Pesticide applicators must be certified or licensed through the Purdue University Extension Service and the Office of the Indiana State Chemist.

Please note that agencies will be required to upload current licensure.

How to apply for PEST?
