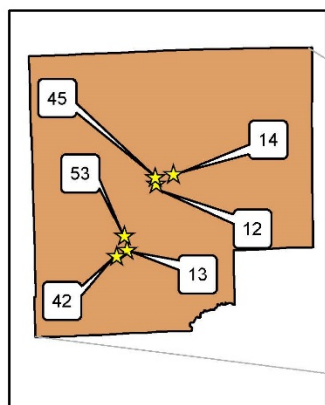

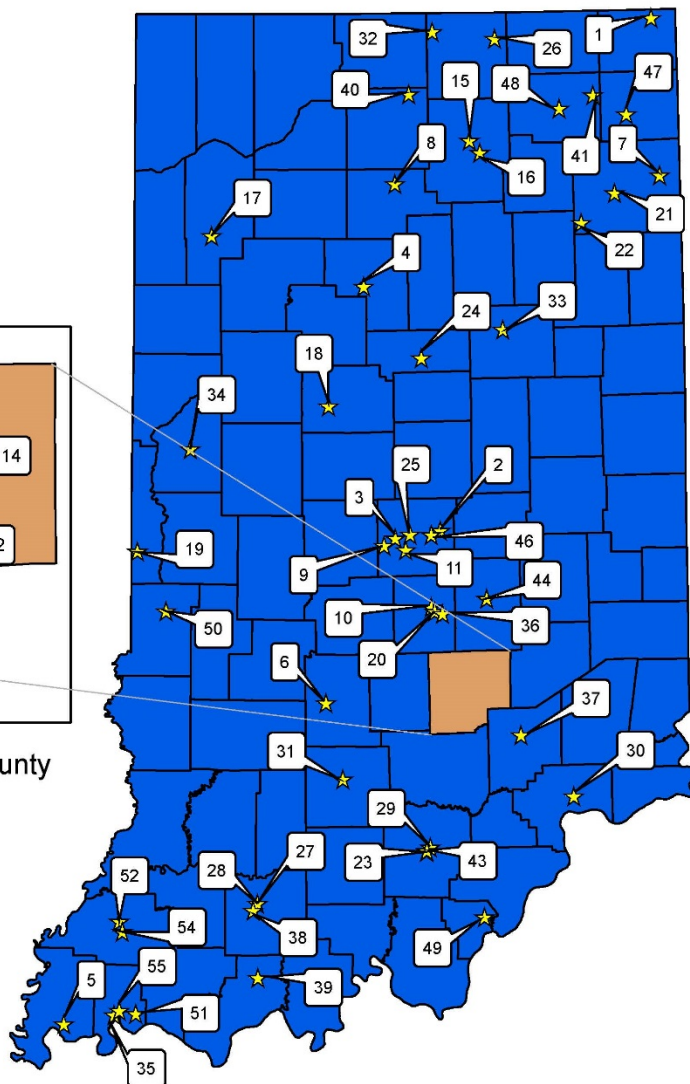

Potential Regulatory Benefits - Air

- Advanced Announcement of Routine Inspections
- Alternative Compliance or Monitoring Strategies
- Alternative Due Date for Certain Quarterly or Semi-Annual Reports
- Assign the Same Inspector
- Assign the Same Permit Writer
- Expedited Permits
- Flexible Permit Language
- Low Routine Inspection Priority
- Reduced Reporting Frequency

Note that all FESOP & MSOP permit renewals have been extended to 10 years and all FESOP & Title V permit renewals have been streamlined.



Potential Regulatory Benefits – Land

- Accelerate Renewal of Existing Land Application Permit
- Reports for the Land Application Program
- Streamlined and Expedited NPDES Renewal Application Process
