Subject: Administrative Letter - DCS-24-5 Missing and Runaway Children

Based on a Rapid Improvement Event (RIE), changes have been made to the reporting of missing and runaway children involved with the Indiana Department of Child Services (DCS).

Effective September 1, 2024, <u>all</u> children missing from care must be reported **immediately** to the DCS Child Abuse and Neglect Hotline (Hotline) at 1-800-800-5556 or <u>DCSHotlineReports@dcs.in.gov</u>.

DCS will require the resource parent to contact the following **immediately** if a child in care is missing or runs away to ensure the child's information is entered in National Center for Missing and Exploited Children (NCMEC) within 24 hours:

- 1. Their local Law Enforcement Agency (LEA), and
- 2. The DCS Hotline at 1-800-800-5556 or DCSHotlineReports@dcs.in.gov.

Note: The Hotline will complete an Information and Referral (I&R) and send to the Local Office for completion of the NCMEC reporting process.

The Family Case Manager (FCM) Supervisor will notify NCMEC **immediately** upon receipt of the I&R. This process will be implemented via a phased rollout by <u>region</u>:

- North Regions (September 1, 2024)
- Central Regions (October 1,2024)
- South Regions (November 1, 2024)

The following policies will be updated to reflect these changes:

- 1. 5.22 Missing and Runaway Children
- 2. 8.16 Resource Parent's Role
