WHAT IS HEALTHY FAMILIES INDIANA?

Healthy Families Indiana (HFI) is a voluntary evidence-based home visitation program that is designed to promote healthy families and healthy children through a variety of services including child development, access to health care, and parent education. It is a multi-site statewide system administered by the Indiana Department of Child Services. Healthy Families Indiana services are available in all 92 counties through 31 sites. Healthy Families Indiana is funded by the Department of Child Services through Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF), Maternal, Infant, Early Childhood Home Visiting (MIECHV) and state funds as well as local funds provided to the HFI sites.



WHY HEALTHY FAMILIES INDIANA?

- HFI will engage families with multiple stressors.
- HFI will promote safe environments for children and families.
- HFI will cultivate and strengthen nurturing parent-child relationships.
- HFI will promote healthy childhood growth and development.
- HFI will enhance family functioning by reducing risk and building protective factors for optimal childhood outcomes.
- HFI will provide staff training and support for professional well-being.
