To the extent that Chapter 5 requires compliance with another NFPA standard, such standard shall be that which is referred to in Chapter 2.

### Dear Board Members.

The following statement will outline my reason for supporting my request for variance. I am currently in my 25th year certified as a firefighter in the great state of Indiana and looking forward to the next 25 years. In my tenure as a firefighter I have had the opportunity to serve and experience several levels of the profession, both good and bad. In my career I have served nearly every rank and level of the fire service which includes Chief/Company Officer ranks. I have found what contributes to a successful Fire Officer is a one that is educated and confident in their ability to lead and perform their Job. My experience as a fire officer has been intense.

Early in my career and as a newly promoted Engine Lieutenant, I was tasked with submitting a budget for my assigned apparatus in which the approval process was nevertheless educational. As Deputy Chief I learned how to deal with local governments, community leaders, taxpayers, oversight budget approval process and tasked with the delivery of fire and emergency services of two townships with populations greater than 7,000, while also dealing with recruitment and retention issues within the department. As an Officer I have been fortunate to have prepared a fire department for an ISO evaluation in which we lowered the ISO rating from a 9/9 to a 4/9.

In 2015, I had the opportunity to attend the Indiana Law Enforcement academy in which I obtained an academic certificate which I believe meets the educational requirements for this variance. This academic certificate certifies that I received a specific education, met the requirements and reached the level of knowledge of a certain profession through several tests (please see transcript) while achieving an academic score of 94.5%.
