Message from the Academy Director

Going back to school in 2020 means a new reality for children across Indiana. Some of the obvious changes include increased sanitation procedures, wearing face masks and new social distancing rules. This may also include more in-depth changes like students eating lunch at their desks, modified schedules that keep students in a single classroom and complex seating arrangements on school buses.

Needless to say, this significant change impacts our children's mental health, and as first responders we have an opportunity to help them understand and cope with this crisis. As schools continue to reopen, here are a few steps first responders can perform to help students adjust to their new way of learning:

- Talk with children about the situation in a way that is easily understandable and age appropriate.
- Provide them with opportunities to discuss their experiences and ask questions.
- Be aware of the mental health resources available in your local area and refer children to them if needed.

It can be difficult to predict how children will respond to these types of traumatic events. Parents, teachers and first responders see children in different perspectives, so it is important for all of us work together and share our knowledge to help them successfully navigate the stress of this new reality.
