IDHS FEDERAL FUNDING STREAMS



State Homeland Security Program (SHSP)

- Assist local preparedness activities that address high-priority preparedness gaps across all core capabilities that support **terrorism preparedness**.
- Risk-driven and capability/high-priority based relating to terrorism preparedness.

Nonprofit Security Grant Program (NSGP)

- Assist local preparedness activities that address high-priority preparedness gaps across all core capabilities that support **terrorism preparedness**.
- Specifically for 501(c)(3) nonprofits
 - Must not receive more than half their funding from public resources.
- Templates are available on the grant management website for organizations to begin preparing for next year.

IDHS FEDERAL FUNDING STREAMS



Hazardous Materials Emergency Preparedness Grant Program (HMEP)

- Assist states, territories and Native American tribes to develop, improve and carry out emergency plans within hazardous transportation.

Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG)

- Assist local preparedness activities in **preparing for all hazards.**
- Supports a comprehensive, all-hazards emergency preparedness system by building and sustaining core capabilities.

IDHS FEDERAL FUNDING STREAMS



Indiana Local Body Camera Grant Program (ILBC)

- The ILBC grant program is an allocated state fund from federal grant money that provides matching grants to local law enforcement agencies that may be used to purchase officer-worn body cameras:
 - The state of Indiana, through procedures established by the Indiana State Police and administered by the Indiana Department of Homeland Security, will provide matching grants to city, town and county law enforcement agencies for the acquisition of body-worn cameras to enable the provision of essential government services, despite substantial reductions in revenue suffered by local entities because of the COVID-19 public health emergency.
 - Grant funds only may be used for the purchase of body cameras and may not be used to purchase video storage equipment or services.
 - Priority 1 funding: Any law enforcement agency that has not previously purchased body-worn cameras will be given highest priority for funding ("Priority 1 Funding"). Priority 1 Funding applicants are eligible to apply for grant funding in an amount not to exceed eight hundred dollars (\$800) per full-time officer employed by the agency.
 - Priority 2 funding: Any law enforcement agency that has previously purchased body-worn cameras will be given second priority for funding ("Priority 2 Funding") for the purchase of additional body-worn cameras. Priority 2 Funding applicants are eligible to apply for grant funding in an amount not to exceed four hundred dollars (\$400) per full-time officer. Availability of Priority 2 Funding will be subject to the amount of Priority 1 Funding awarded.
 - To be eligible for Priority 1 or Priority 2 funding, each law enforcement agency applicant shall certify that it has implemented or will implement a body-worn camera policy prior to the expenditure of any funds for which it will request reimbursement under the ILBC Grant Program.

IDHS STATE FUNDING STREAMS



Homeland Security Foundation Grant Program (Foundation)

- Supports public safety projects with a focus on ensuring citizen safety.
- Supported by the Secure Indiana license plate.
- Priority areas include:
 - Lifesaving activities
 - Day-to-day operational requirements
 - Improvements to existing capabilities

Homeland Security Foundation Grant Program (Scholarships)

- Supports students enrolled in higher education programs with a public safety concentration.
 - Full-time students can apply for \$2,000
 - Part-time students can apply for \$1,000

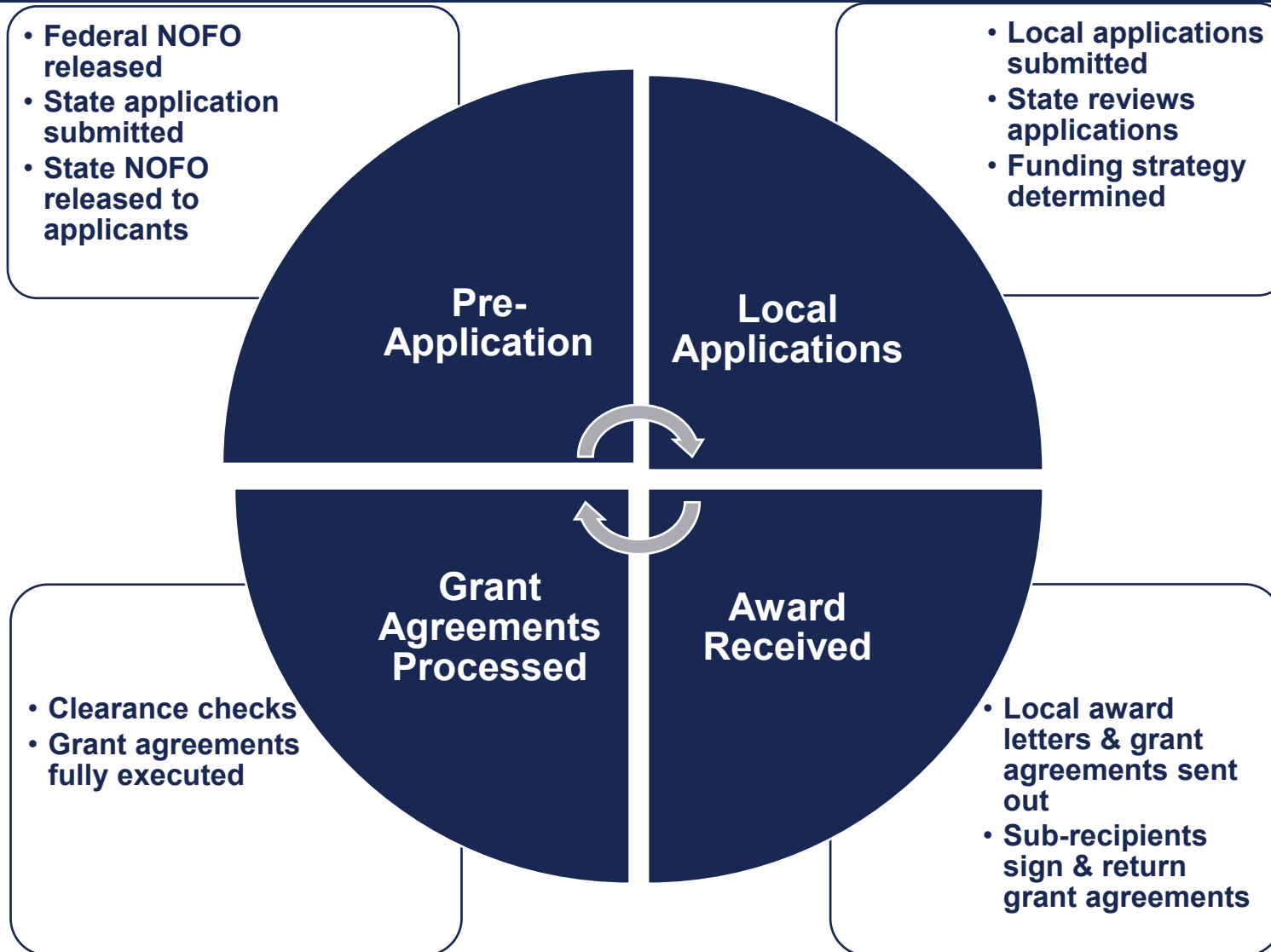
IDHS STATE FUNDING STREAMS



Secured School Safety Grant (SSSG)

- The SSSG program is an allocated state fund that provides matching grants to school corporations, accredited non-public (i.e., private) schools, charter schools and coalitions of school corporations. SSSG funds may be used to:
 - Employ a school resource officer (SRO); employ a law enforcement officer (LEO); provide school resource officer training described in IC 20-26-18.2(b)(2);
 - Purchase equipment and technology to:
 - Restrict access to school property; or
 - Expedite notifications to local law enforcement and first responders
 - Conduct a threat assessment
 - Provide firearm and self-defense trainings
 - Cover initial set up costs for an active event warning system with the county's sheriff's department.
(No match requirement)
 - Implement a student and parent support services plan.

IDHS GRANT CYCLE



UNIQUE ENTITY IDENTIFIER (UEI) NUMBER



Unique Entity Identifier (UEI) number is a unique numeric identifier created in the System for Awards Management (SAM) at <https://www.sam.gov/SAM/> using a browser such as Chrome, Firefox or Safari.

- Federal requirement to receive grant funds
- If applicants believe they possess an active UEI number, they should call the request line to verify their UEI number
- On **April 4, 2022**, the unique entity identifier used across the federal government changed from the DUNS Number to the Unique Entity ID (generated by SAM.gov).

PREPARATION FOR GRANT APPLICATIONS



- Must have an active UEI number registered with SAM.GOV as it is a federal requirement with federal funding.
- Must have an active Supplier and Bidder number with state of Indiana.
- Must have an account within IDHS grant management system, IntelliGrants to apply.
 - Check with your entity's Subgrantee Administrator (SGA) to update organization's members and information. Can add and delete members within the organization and application documents for accessibility.
- Make sure your project meets all requirements within the grants, are realistic and can be completed within the period of performance.
(POP)

SUPPLANTING



- Grant funds must be used to supplement existing funds for program activities and cannot replace or supplant non-grant funds that have been appropriated for the same purpose.

UNALLOWABLE ITEMS



- Food and beverage costs
- Equipment sustainment
 - Oil changes
 - Routine maintenance



AUTHORIZED EQUIPMENT LIST (AEL)

- The Authorized Equipment List (AEL) is a list of approved equipment types allowed under FEMA's preparedness grant programs.
 - Specifically for NSGP, EMPG and SHSP. Always verify against the NOFO.
- **If project includes equipment, confirm the allowability through FEMA's authorized equipment list (AEL) website prior to submitting proposal.**

EHP FORM



Environmental and Historic Preservation (EHP) Screening Form

- Review process begins with submission of an EHP Screening Form
- Screening Form requires a detailed project description that explains the objectives of the proposed project, along with supporting documentation including photos
- FEMA uses this information to determine if the proposed project has the potential to affect the environmental and/or historic properties
- Projects will be sent for final review to U.S. DHS/FEMA headquarters
- **Projects should NOT start until FEMA has approved the EHP**
- **Once an EHP is approved, no changes can be made**

PROJECTS THAT REQUIRE EHP



Ground disturbances

- Anything that breaks ground or changes the condition of the grounds surface
- Construction, additions, modifications, renovations of new facilities or existing structures
- Cameras, generators, access controls, etc.

Physical security enhancements

- Interior/exterior
- Grounds
- Doors, lights, fences, bollards, etc.

PROJECTS THAT REQUIRE EHP



Construction/modification of communication towers

- Addition of antennas, mounting equipment or shelters

Training/exercises

- Involve ground disturbance
- Not conducted at a designated training facility

Mobile equipment

- Involve radar/sonar technology

PROJECTS THAT DO NOT REQUIRE EHP



- Preparation of Planning Documents
- Classroom-based training/table-top exercises only
- Training or exercises at designated training facilities using established procedures for a specific training/exercise
- Hand-held mobile equipment and supplies
- Motorized vehicles, watercraft or trailers that will use existing staging or storage areas
- Personal protective equipment (PPE)
- Plug-in equipment; requires no wiring or installation onto walls, ceilings or floors

APPLICATION TIPS



- Make a strong link to the assessment/THIRA/SPR that found gaps
- Explain how project will close gaps
- Make a strong tie to terrorism or prioritized core capabilities
- Make sure project and descriptions fit the national priority description and sample projects in the federal NOFO
- If project will enhance collaboration with other entities, please explain who and how
- Explain the urgency of need for this project – why is it important this project be funded now versus in a year or two
- Proofread and make a final review to make sure the questions asked are answered before submission

INTELLIGRANTS REGISTRATION



- Make a request to your organization's current Subgrantee Administrator about creating a user account and having you added to the organization and necessary application documents.
- If organization doesn't exist, please take the next 10-15 minutes to register for an IntelliGrants account.

 - New accounts are not immediately created so please allow up to three business days for a response.

EMPG COMPLIANCE



All EMPG funded personnel must complete the following FEMA trainings and an HSEEP exercise

- National Incident Management System Training: IS 100;
- National Incident Management System Training: IS 200;
- National Incident Management System Training: IS 700;
- National Incident Management System Training: IS 800;
- FEMA Professional Development Series: IS 120;
- FEMA Professional Development Series: IS 230;
- FEMA Professional Development Series: IS 235;
- FEMA Professional Development Series: IS 240;
- FEMA Professional Development Series: IS 241;
- FEMA Professional Development Series: IS 242; and
- FEMA Professional Development Series: IS 244.

For the HSEEP exercise requirement, the county can upload a certification and/ or a sign-in sheet for HSEEP compliance

- Web-based Emergency Operations Center
- Information management system
 - Used for crises applications to daily operations
 - Single, identical display of operational information
 - Share same message across jurisdictions
 - Immediate
 - Endless sharing and collaboration of information
 - Simplified access to information
 - No limit to number of users

- Incident to use
 - 2022 WebEOC Monthly Test Exercise
- Required Action
 - EOC Activation Change
- Suggestive Action
 - EOC Activation Change
 - Travel Advisory Change
- Opportunity to remain proficient

WEBEOC POST



- **What** - A brief synopsis, including:
 - Threat – the nature of the problem
 - Vulnerability – why this is a problem
 - Consequences – the potential impact of the incident
 - Incident Priorities (Life Safety, Incident Stabilization, or Property Conservation)
- **Where** - location of the report, be as specific as possible
- **When** – the time and date of the report
- **Who** - the name of the person making the report, and the agency he or she works for

TYPES OF INCIDENTS



- All Hazards
 - Potential to expand beyond capability of day-to-day operations
 - Any vulnerabilities and potential impacts
 - Crosses multiple jurisdictions
- Severe weather
- Incidents involving interstate closures
- Working HazMat incident
- Large fires involving more than one department
- Unknown substance calls
 - Schools, Government Facilities, etc.
- Bomb or EOD activity
- Active shooter incidents

TYPES OF INCIDENT CONT.



- Serious injury or death of public safety personnel
- Dam or levee problems/issues
- Industrial accidents
- Explosions of any kind
- Hazardous radiation incident
- Search and rescue operations
 - Amber/Silver Alerts
- Structural collapses
- Train derailments

SUPERFUND AMENDMENTS AND REAUTHORIZATION ACT



Also known as SARA

- Title III of SARA is known as the Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act (EPCRA).
 - Identify the storage, use and release of chemicals.
 - Foster communication between facilities that handle hazardous chemicals and their communities.
 - Expand emergency planning for hazardous chemical accidents and enhance emergency response capabilities for hazardous chemical incidents.
- Under Section 312 of EPCRA, facilities are required to submit a Tier II form to state, local officials and the public on potential hazards. The information includes the locations and amounts of hazardous chemicals present at a facility during the previous calendar year.

INDIANA EMERGENCY RESPONSE COMMISSION (IERC)



- Meets bimonthly on the second Monday at 1:30 p.m. EST starting in January.
- A virtual option for attendance will always be available.
 - The meeting information can be found <https://www.in.gov/dhs/boards-and-commissions/indiana-emergency-response-commission/>
- The IERC was established to implement the Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know act of 1986 (EPCRA).

LOCAL EMERGENCY PLANNING COMMITTEE (LEPC)



- LEPCs develop and maintain an emergency response plan to deal with accidental chemical releases from facilities in their respective county.
- LEPCs also provide information, upon request, about chemicals in the community to the general public.
 - A LEPC can also direct the public records request to IDHS <https://www.in.gov/dhs/public-records-request-web-form/>
- Compliant LEPCs receive funds from Tier II Facility fees once a year. This money can be spent on training, hazmat equipment, etc.
 - See IC 6-6-10-7(b) for a complete list of LEPC spending categories.

LEPC COMPLIANCE



- The LEPC has several activities to complete throughout the year to be compliant and receive funding.
 - Jan. 31 – Legal Notice
 - March 1 – Bylaws
 - March 1 – Roster
 - March 1 – Fiscal/Auditors Report (prior year)
 - May 1 – Exercise Proposal Report
 - The final exercise report needs to be uploaded 60 days after the exercise.
 - The exercise is not required to be HSEEP-complaint.
 - Oct. 16 – Hazardous Materials Response Plan
 - Complete and upload of at least four meetings and meeting minutes
 - Two meeting in the first half of the year and two meetings in the second half.
