



TRAVEL ADVISORY TUTORIAL

ADVISORY

The lowest level of local travel advisory means that routine travel or activities may be restricted in areas because of a hazardous situation, and individuals should use caution or avoid those areas.

WATCH

A watch means that conditions are threatening to the safety of the public. During this type of local travel advisory, only essential travel, such as to and from work or in emergency situations, is recommended, and emergency action plans should be implemented by businesses, schools, government agencies and other organizations.

WARNING

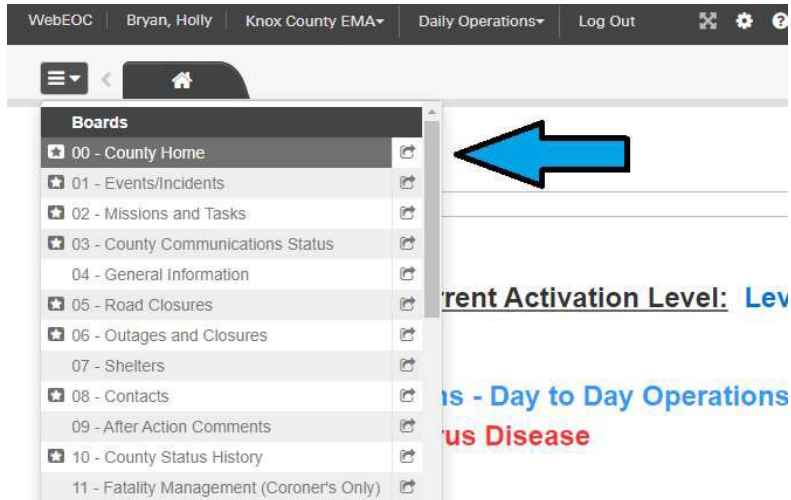
The highest level of local travel advisory means that travel may be restricted to emergency management workers only. During a warning local travel advisory, individuals are directed to:

- Refrain from all travel
- Comply with necessary emergency measures
- Cooperate with public officials and disaster services forces in executing emergency operations plans
- Obey and comply with the lawful directions of properly identified officers

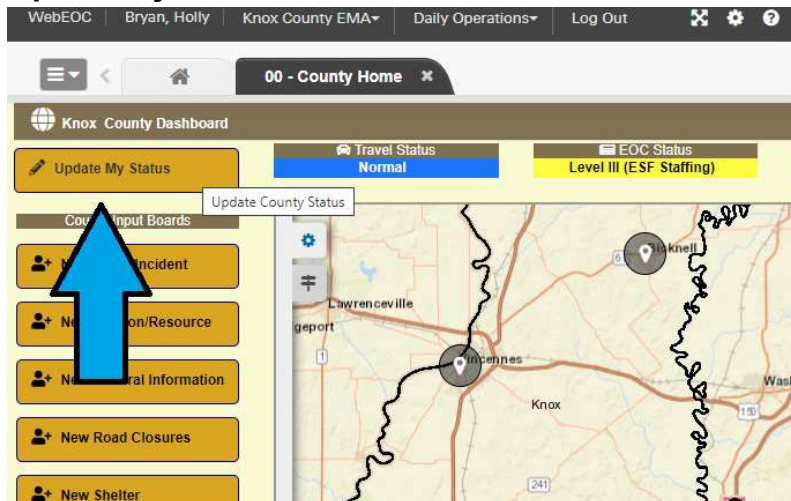
An extra note to think about is if you are anticipating a weekend severe weather event and anticipate a travel warning. A good rule of thumb is to contact your county Commissioners Administrator and notify the person of the possibility. This way the wheels will be in motion in the event you do need to work with your county to declare a warning.

HOW TO UPDATE YOUR COUNTY'S TRAVEL STATUS (WEBEOC)

1. From the control panel, select **00 – County Home**.



2. Select **Update My Status**.



3. Select the appropriate status and then select **Save**.
