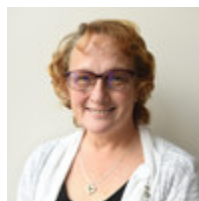
April 23 - NSGP and SHSP grant application period closes

New Director of Emergency Management Announced



IDHS has named Mary Moran, a 21-year veteran in emergency management, as the new director of Emergency Management for Indiana.

Mary brings extensive experience in disaster response and recovery. She joined the state team as a program coordinator in mitigation for what was then the State Emergency Management Agency (SEMA) before IDHS was formed in 2005. She has served as the state hazard mitigation officer, mitigation branch chief and most recently as the state recovery officer. Mary has a master's degree in emergency management from Indiana University.

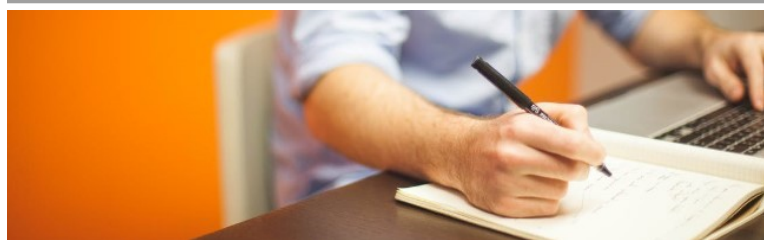
PPE Update

It appears the availability of PPE has begun to normalize. IDHS is no longer receiving FEMA PPE shipments and has successfully utilized the existing supplier network in Indiana. In regards to PPE for COVID-19 response, it appears funding or availability of items should not be a barrier for local agencies.

Moving forward, IDHS will be limited in its fulfillment of requests for PPE unless the requestor can specifically identify they do not have access to funding, is not eligible for reimbursement from FEMA or has not been able to source the required items.

The [Quantity Purchase Agreements](#) provided by the Indiana Department of Administration are contracts sourced on behalf of the state and many of them (such as Fastenal, Grainger and Office Depot) include provisions that the pricing and availability must also be made available to local governmental entities, K-12 schools, etc.

In addition, the [Indiana PPE Directory](#) features Indiana companies that manufacture and distribute a variety of PPE items available for purchase. All vendors are required to be headquartered or incorporated in Indiana, to provide free shipping to Indiana businesses and schools and to abide by additional requirements.
