As the temperatures continue to drop and we move into the winter months, knowing how to avoid, spot and treat **frostbite** and **hypothermia** can be the difference between life and death.

Avoid: When the weather is frigid, try to stay indoors. If you must go outside, be sure to wear: a scarf or mask that covers the face & mouth, gloves, a hat, a water-resistant coat and several layers of loose-fitting clothing.

Spot: The first signs of **frostbite** may be redness or pain in any skin area. Other signs include a white or grayish-yellow skin area and skin that feels unusually firm or waxy numbness. Signs of **hypothermia** include shivering, exhaustion, confusion, fumbling hands, memory loss, slurred speech and drowsiness.

Treat: If you are not able to get medical help right away, try to get the person into a warm room or shelter and remove any wet clothing the person is wearing. For **hypothermia**, it's essential to warm the center of the person's body. For **frostbite**, put the affected areas in warm (not hot) water (the temperature should be comfortable to the touch for unaffected parts of the body).

The Indiana Department of Homeland Security (IDHS) and the Indiana Department of Environmental Management (IDEM) has launched a program to collect Per- and Polyfluoroalkyl (PFAS) foam from Indiana fire agencies.

The State will remove and properly dispose of PFAS material from any agency that requests it. **This is a free service with no additional requirements for fire agencies.**

To better understand how much PFAS- containing AFFF firefighting foam is present in Indiana, EMA's are asked to reach out to their local fire departments and counties to complete the survey below. Thank you in advance for your cooperation and collaboration regarding this joint initiative.
