## CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL

Meeting called to order at 3:00 pm by Chairman Lee Turpen. Ms. Candice Hilton called roll and announced quorum. Commissioner Olinger arrived at 3:02 pm.

Chairman Turpen introduced Mr. Dale Henson and turned the floor over to Mr. Henson. Mr. Henson welcomed everyone to the Indiana Emergency Responder Conference and the EMS Commission meeting. Mr. Henson stated that there are about 85 classes to take part in at the conference this year.

## HONORARY CERTIFICATIONS

Mr. Jason Smith read Mr. Jason Renner's letter requesting an honorary certification for Mr. Ernest (Bill) W. Pape Jr. into record(see attachment #1). Mr. Pape's original certification date was June 27, 1977.

**A motion was made by Commissioner Zartman to approve the honorary certification. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Hamilton. The motion passed.**

Mr. Kraig Kinney read his letter requesting an honorary certification for Sandy Park-Teelon into record (see attachment #2). Ms. Park-Teelon's original certification date was June 20, 1985.

**A motion was made by Commissioner Mackey to approve the honorary certification. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Zartman. The motion passed.**

## ADOPTION OF MINUTES

- a. June 19, 2015 meeting minutes

**A motion was made by Commissioner Mackey to approve the minutes as written. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Champion. The motion passed. The minutes were approved.**

## INDIANA DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH

- a. Trauma Registry (see attachment #3)

Mrs. Katie Hokanson briefly went over the Narcan Report. Mrs. Hokanson asked the Commission members if there is any additional information they would like to see in the report. Mrs. Hokanson also asked if any of the members had any questions for her in regards to the report. Commissioner Mackey asked if the primary impression was prior to EMS arrival. Mrs. Hokanson stated that it was not prior to EMS arrival it was the EMS personnel primary impression and to report a secondary impression is an optional field. Commissioner Zartman asked if prior to EMS arrival if there is any way to see who administered Narcan like law enforcement, lay person, fire fighter. Mrs. Hokanson stated that she would look into that for Commissioner Zartman. Legal Counsel Pam Walters arrived at 3:08pm.

Mrs. Katie Hokanson stated that at the beginning of July there were about 208 EMS providers reporting data consistently.

Mrs. Katie Hokanson stated that the Health Department has requested updates from two hospitals, Good Samaritan Hospital and Community Health North Hospital. Both hospitals should be reporting at the next Trauma Care Committee meeting. This will not require any action from the EMS Commission this report is just to make sure the hospitals are on track to become ACS verified.

Mrs. Hokanson made a few brief comments regarding the Medical Director's conference. Mrs. Hokanson received several positive comments back in regards to the keynote speakers. Commissioner Sue Dunham arrived at 3:18pm.

### EMS FOR CHILDREN (EMSC)

Ms. Courtney VanJelgerhuis reported on the pilot program that EMSC is currently working on for training school nurses in emergency care. EMSC is partnering with the Board of Education for this program. EMSC currently has had 99 school nurses to take the on line training modules that have to be completed prior to the in person training. The school nurses have complete all of the on line modules first then are able to register for the in person training. Ms. VanJelgerhuis reports that this program is off to a good start.

### TECHNICAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE (TAC)

a. Report

Chairman Leon Bell reported that the TAC has not met since the last Commission meeting due to the National Highway Traffic and Safety Association (NHTSA) assessment taking place on July 7<sup>th</sup>. The TAC will meet on September 1<sup>st</sup> at Noblesville Fire Department Station #77.

Director Michael Garvey stated that the agency is currently working with the Governor's office regarding the three new appointees to the TAC.

### INDIANA EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES ASSOCIATION (IEMSA)

Mr. Garrett Hedeem reported for the IEMSA. Mr. Hedeem reported that IEMSA now has a memorandum of understanding with Indiana MIH consortium this will enable people to donate to the memorial. IEMSA has started the process for developing a challenge coin for fund raising portion of the EMS memorial.

### EMS EDUCATION WORKING GROUP

Mr. Kraig Kinney reported for the education group. Mr. Kinney reported that the Education working group met earlier in the day. This meeting was the first meeting the group has held since the election of officers so this meeting was used as a planning meeting. Several sub-groups were formed at today's meeting to work on different topics. Some of the things that the Education working group has been working on is an educational newsletter to be sent out to the EMS Community, Tactical Medicine curriculum, NTSHA

assessment group is on hold, education requirements, and practical exam scenarios. The group will meet again in October.

#### PERSONNEL WAIVER REQUESTS

The following requested a waiver of 836 IAC 4-5-2 Certification and recertification; general Authority: IC 16-31-2-7; IC 16-31-3-14; IC 16-31-3-14.5; IC 16-31-3-20 Affected: IC 16-31-3-14 Sec. 2 which reads: (a) Application for certification will be made on forms and according to procedures prescribed by the agency. In order to be certified as an emergency medical services primary instructor, the applicant shall meet one (1) of the following requirements: (1) Successfully complete a commission-approved Indiana emergency medical services primary instructor training course and complete all of the following: (A) Successfully complete the primary instructor written examination. (B) Successfully complete the primary instructor training program. (C) Be currently certified as an Indiana emergency medical technician. (D) Successfully pass the Indiana basic emergency medical services written and practical skills examinations within one (1) year prior to applying for certification as a primary instructor. Mr. Blaisuis is requesting a waiver for more time to complete process for primary instructor certification. He states he can start the student teaching internship beginning October of this year. Staff recommends: approval. Although Mr. Blaisuis has not completed any of the testing requirements for Primary Instructor certification, our current rules do not put a time limit between the end of the PI course and the date of PI certification.

Christopher Blaisuis - Paramedic

**A motion was made by Commissioner Zartman to table the waiver until the October meeting. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Hoggatt. Discussion followed regarding the Primary Instructor certification process. The motion passed.**

**A motion was made by Commissioner Zartman to have the TAC review the Primary Instructor certification process. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Olinger. The motion passed.**

The following requested a waiver of 836 IAC 4-4-1 which reads (b) The applicant shall apply for certification on forms provided by the agency postmarked within one (1) year of the date that the course was concluded as shown on the course report. Ms. Campbell is asking for more time to complete the requirement to become certified as an EMT. Ashleigh completed EMT Class course number B18-01-14 which had an end of April 14, 2014. Due to Ashleigh's father being ill put on life support in April of this year she ran out of time to take her 3d attempt at the written examination. Her first 2 attempts were in July of 2014 and April 2015. She passed the practical in May of 2014. Staff Recommends approve for 90 days. She will need a new practical as well since it is now over 1 year old.

Ashleigh Campbell – EMT

**A motion was made by Commissioner Olinger to approve staff recommendation. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Lockard. The motion passed.**

The following requested a waiver of 836 IAC 4-4-1 which reads (b) The applicant shall apply for certification on forms provided by the agency postmarked within one (1) year of the date that the course was concluded as shown on the course report. Ms. Washington is asking for more time to complete the requirement to become certified as an EM Timia completed EMT Class course number B49-05-14 which had an end of May 10, 2014. Due to walking for graduation, Timia missed her scheduled practical and later took it with another class on August 2, 2014 which she passed. She did not attempt to take the written test until May 13, 2015 which was 3 days past her 1 year time limit. Staff Recommend: approve for 90 days. She will need a new practical as well since it is now over 1 year old.

Timia Washington - EMT

**A motion was made by Commissioner Zartman to approve the waiver for a 90 day extension to complete both exams if necessary. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Hamilton. The motion passed.**

### **PROVIDER WAIVER REQUESTS**

The following requested a waiver of 836 IAC 2-1 (h)(4) General requirements for Paramedic provider organization which reads (h) During the transport of the patient, the following are the minimum staffing requirements: (A) If paramedic level advanced life support treatment techniques have been initiated or are needed: (i) the ambulance must be staffed by at least a paramedic and an emergency medical technician; and (ii) a paramedic shall be in the patient compartment. Alcoa is requesting a renewal of their waiver of the 24 hour rule. Alcoa is a transporting paramedic provider requesting a waiver for required personnel at the Advanced Life Support level. In their most recent certification period they have had 4 open positions and they hired 2 paramedics and 2 EMTs. Their intent is to still try and hire paramedics when openings become available. Staff recommends: approval- with the stipulation of reporting to the agency the following: 6 month update, and e-mail to area district manager each time this occurs.

ALCOA

**A motion was made by Commissioner Mackey to approve the waiver. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Hoggatt. The motion passed.**

The following requested a waiver of 836 IAC 2-14-3 Advanced life support nontransport vehicle specifications which reads (b) All advanced life support nontransport vehicles shall meet or exceed the following minimum specifications for electrical systems: (3) Each advanced life support nontransport vehicle shall have an audible backup warning device that is activated when the advanced life support nontransport vehicle is shifted into reverse. (c) All advanced life support nontransport vehicles shall meet the following requirements for external identification: (1) Warning lights of red or red and white, at the discretion of the owner, and shall conform with Indiana law. All lights on vehicle shall be in working condition. (2) Each advanced life support nontransport vehicle shall display the four (4) numbers of the commission-assigned advanced life support nontransport vehicle certification number. The four (4) numbers, in sequence, shall be placed on each side of the advanced life support nontransport vehicle on the right and left front fenders and on the rear portion of the vehicle. Each number shall be in block letters not less than three (3) inches in height. These numbers shall be displayed in color contrasting, reflective material. The numbers shall be placed on the vehicle within seven (7) days of the receipt of the advanced life support nontransport vehicle certificate. The numbers shall be removed or permanently covered by the provider organization when the advanced life support nontransport vehicle is permanently removed from service by the provider organization. (3) A commission-certified vehicle sticker shall be displayed on all certified advanced life support nontransport vehicles. 836 IAC 2-2-3 Paramedic provider organization operating procedures which reads (b) Each paramedic provider organization shall establish daily equipment checklist procedures to ensure the following: (1) Electronic and mechanical equipment are in proper operating condition. (2) Emergency response vehicles are maintained in a safe operating condition at all times. (3) All required medications and intravenous fluids approved by the medical director of the paramedic provider organization and the supervising hospital are on board all nontransport emergency medical services vehicles and ambulances when used for the provision of advanced life support and available to the paramedic. (4) Equipment, medication, fluid, and supplies have not exceeded the manufacturer's specified expiration date. (c) A copy of the medication list and protocols signed by the medical director shall be maintained by the paramedic provider organization and the supervising hospital emergency department. Any changes to the medications list shall be forwarded to the agency within thirty (30) days. (d) All medications and advanced life support supplies are to be supplied by order of the medical director. Accountability for: (1) distribution; (2) storage; (3) ownership; and (4) security; of medications is subject to applicable requirements as determined by the medical director, pharmacist, and the United States Department of Justice Drug Enforcement Administration.

Northwest Regional Medical

**A motion was made by Commissioner Zartman to approve the waiver. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Champion. The motion passed.**

The following requested a waiver of SECTION 16. (a) This SECTION supersedes 836 IAC 2-7.2-3 which reads (B) Endotracheal intubation devices, including the following (i) Laryngoscope with extra batteries and bulbs (ii) Laryngoscope blades (adult and pediatric, curved and straight) (iii) Disposable endotracheal tubes, a minimum of two (2) each, sterile packaged, in sizes 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, and 9 millimeters inside diameter. (D) Medications limited to, if approved by the medical director, the following: (i) Acetylsalicylic acid (aspirin). (ii) Adenosine. (iii) Atropine sulfate. (iv) Bronchodilator (beta 2 agonists): (AA) suggested commonly administered medications: (aa) albuterol; (bb) ipratropium; (cc) isoetharine; (dd) metaproterenol; (ee) salmeterol; (ff) terbutaline; and (gg) triamcinolone; and (BB) commonly administered adjunctive medications to bronchodilator therapy: (aa) dexamethasone; and (bb) methylprednisolone. (v) Dextrose. (vi) Diazepam. (vii) Epinephrine (1:1,000). (viii) Epinephrine (1:10,000). (ix) Vasopressin. (x) Furosemide. (xi) Lidocaine hydrochloride, two percent (2%). (xii) Amiodarone hydrochloride. (xiii) Morphine sulfate. (xiv) Naloxone. (xv) Nitroglycerin. City of Rushville Fire Department is requesting a waiver of the equipment and medications in the Intermediate rules. City of Rushville Fire Department has ADV EMTs that are certified at the ALS level. Currently our rules do not have ADV EMT so the provider needs to follow the rules at the intermediate level. Staff recommends: Approval

Rushville Fire Department

**A motion was made by Commissioner Mackey to approve the waiver. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Zartman. The motion passed.**

The following requested a waiver of 836 IAC 2-7.2-1 General requirements for Advanced/Intermediate EMT provider organization which reads (g) The emergency medical technician-intermediate provider organization shall do the following: (2) Maintain an adequate number of trained personnel and emergency response vehicles to provide continuous, twenty-four (24) hour advanced life support services. Rushville Fire Department is requesting a waiver of the 24 hour rule. Rushville Fire Department is a BLS Transport Provider requesting to move to the Advanced/Intermediate Transport Provider and is asking for a waiver for required personnel at the Advanced Life Support level. Currently there are 4 full-time Advanced EMTs and 1 part-time on-call Paramedic on Rushville Fire Department. They also have 1 full-time and 1 part-time on-call EMT that are able to take the National Registry test for Advanced EMT. This would put 2 advanced EMTs on 2 shifts and 1 on the third. They work on a 24 on/48 off rotation. With budget restrictions there may be times when there would not be adequate coverage. They have mutual aid agreements in place for ALS coverage if needed. There are plans for another Advanced EMT course that would include at least 3 full-time FF/EMTs and 3 part-time/on-call EMTs. Staff recommends: approval- with the stipulation of reporting to the agency the following: 6 month update e-mail to area district manager each time this occurs

Rushville Fire Department

**A motion was made by Commissioner Hoggatt to approve the waiver. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Olinger. The motion passed.**

IC 16-31-3 which reads (D) Medications limited to, if approved by the medical director, the following: (i) Acetylsalicylic acid (aspirin). (ii) Adenosine. (iii) Atropine sulfate. (iv) Bronchodilator (beta 2 agonists): (AA) suggested commonly administered medications: (aa) albuterol; (bb) ipratropium; (cc) isoetharine; (dd) metaproterenol; (ee) salmeterol; (ff) terbutaline; and (gg) triamcinolone; and (BB) commonly administered adjunctive medications to bronchodilator therapy: (aa) dexamethasone; and (bb) methylprednisolone. The following requested a waiver of 836 IAC 2-2-1 General requirements for paramedic provider organizations which reads (g) Each paramedic provider organization shall do the following: (1) Maintain an adequate number of trained personnel and emergency response vehicles to provide continuous, twenty-four (24) hour advanced life support services. Switzerland County EMS is requesting a waiver of the 24 hour rule. Switzerland County is a paramedic service and is asking for a waiver for infrequent periods when they might not have 24 hour coverage due to circumstances beyond their control such as a car break down, sickness, family issues, ect. They have mutual aid agreements in place for ALS coverage if needed. They have an individual in paramedic class who should be certified by early Spring. Staff recommends: approval- with the stipulation of reporting to the agency the following: 6 month update, e-mail to area district manager each time this occurs.

Switzerland County EMS

**A motion was made by Commissioner Zartman to table this waiver to give staff time to research. The motion was seconded by Commissioner McCullough. Discussion regarding if Switzerland County needs this waiver or if it is time to renew the waiver followed. The motion to table the waiver for staff to have time to research passed.**

## **STAFF REPORTS**

- A. Data Report (see attachment #4) - Ms. Angie Biggs reported out. Ms. Biggs asked the Commission members what reports they would like to see from this meeting forward from IDHS. Some discussion followed as to what the members would like to see. The members asked for some reports to see what kinds of reports are available. After further discussion the Commission asked for a list of "canned" reports that can be ran and some sample reports for the next meeting. Assistant Fire Marshal also announced that Robin Stump, Angie Biggs, and one of the agency IOT personnel is being sent out to Colorado for training on Image Trend.
- B. Operations Report -Ms. Robin Stump reported out. Ms. Stump announced that there would be a Medical Director forum next Tuesday (August 25<sup>th</sup>) for district 5 with Dr. Michael Olinger. Ms. Stump stated that district managers have been out working on investigations and inspections. Ms. Stump commented that investigations have increased. Ms. Stump reminded everyone about the Indiana Rural Health Initiative webinars. Ms. Stump announced two upcoming TECCS courses supervisor courses in September. The courses are 3 days long. One course will be held in Ft. Wayne and the other will be held in Vincennes. The courses are limited to 20 students. More information will be forth coming. Director Garvey commented that this course is being held in conjunction with the Fire and Safety Academy. Trainings like this one will be opened up to Fire, EMS, Law enforcement and EMAs even if the training is initiated by EMS. Fire Marshal Jim Greeson spoke about the Fire and Safety Academy. Marshal Greeson stated that nothing as far as the EMS Commission, and the Fire Boards roles will change. Certifications will not change either. More training will be developed one example is telecommunications training to make it more uniform is being developed. The Marshal also said that if there are any questions to contact the Fire Marshal's office.

- C. Certifications report (see attachment #5 ) Commissioner Lockard inquired about the POST training numbers and what will be done about those that have not completed the training. Ms. Candice Hilton stated that staff is working on drafting a letter for the Commission's approval to be sent to those that have not completed the training.
- D. Training Report (see attachment #6) Mr. Tony Pagano announced that the Indiana is about the National average with AEMT test scores. Mr. Pagano reported that the next phase of the IU EMT exam validation is taking place. Mr. Pagano also stated that the PI exam has been updated and is now in place. The EMR exam has been updated and is now in place. The EMR and EVOC exams are now available as electronic exams and instructors are being to use the electronic version of the exam. Mr. Pagano briefly discussed the process that was gone through to review the PI exam. Mr. Pagano asked that the Commission have the TAC look at the NEMSE training and testing for the possibility of using that training and testing for Indiana. Director Garvey started a discussion of how to look as the bigger picture and look at a base training for all public safety instructors. The Commission members agreed with the concept of the Fire Training Academy and consolidating training for public safety personnel.

### **STATE EMS MEDICAL DIRECTOR'S REPORT**

Dr. Olinger reported that the 2<sup>nd</sup> annual Medical Director Conference was held earlier in the day and it was a success. Dr. Olinger thanked all of the Department of Health for putting the conference together and also thanked the speakers. Dr. Olinger also stated that we need to get the Quality assurance plan together to move forward with data collection.

### **STATE EMS DIRECTOR'S REPORT**

Director Michael Garvey reported that Don Watson District manager is on his way to California to go and shadow the Incident Management team out there during the wild fires. Director Garvey announced to the Commission member to be looking for an email from our legal department with information on taking Ethics training in September. Director Garvey encouraged everyone to look at and become familiar with the Compass project for further information go to their web site at [emscompass.org](http://emscompass.org). Director Garvey encouraged everyone to become involved with helping write the performance evaluations and standards. This project is in its beginning stages. Indiana can either help shape the standards or wait for someone else to shape them. Director Garvey announced that the National Highway and Traffic Safety Association (NHTSA) final report has been release to the Commission and will be release to everyone soon. There are 59 recommendations in the final report. The goal is to have a strategic plan by December of 2015. Director Garvey would like to see the Commission become a more proactive Commission instead of a reactive Commission.

### **CHAIRMAN'S REPORT AND DIRECTION**

Chairman Lee Turpen mirrored Director Garvey's comments in regards to the Commission needing to be proactive instead of reactive. Chairman Turpen also stated that he feels that providers are using data reporting issues as an excuse. Chairman Turpen feels that it is irresponsible of providers to not submit data.





Prior Aid


### Number of Incidents where Narcan was Given Prior to EMS Arrival




