**CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL**

Meeting called to order at 10:00am by Chairman Lee Turpen. Mrs. Candice Pope called roll and announced quorum.

**ADOPTION OF MINUTES**

- a. Adoption of minutes from the December 16 , 2016 session.

A motion was made by Commissioner Mackey approve with the following changed to make a change to the minutes of the December 16, 2017. A change to move the waiver of Logansport Fire department to table. Take out the word approved as you can't have approve and table. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Valentine. The motion passed.

A Motion was made by Commissioner Mackey to approve the minutes of the executive session. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Valentine. The motion passed.

#### **Honorary Certifications**

- a. Paunicka, Joseph (see attachment #1)

A motion was made by Commissioner Valentine to approve all the honorary certification. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Hamilton. The motion passed.

#### **INDIANA DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH**

Mrs. Katie Holkonson notified the EMS Commission of the date of the EMS Medical Director's conference on April 28, 2017 at the Indianapolis Marriott North. Registration will be open soon. She also reported that the DOSE program with Caption Carroll is coming back to Indiana and will be delivering the program at several location in March 2017.

#### **EMS FOR CHILDREN (EMSC)**

Ms. Margo Knefelkamp announced EMSC is currently accepting nominees for Pediatric Heroes. The deadline for submission is April 1, 2017. She also notified every one of the Pediatric Disaster Course going on March 27 & 28, 2017. The course will be held at the Indianapolis EMS Conference Center on Georgetown Road, Indianapolis, IN. There are still openings for those that would like to apply. They are also conducting a survey and that will be open on March 1, 2017 if providers would complete the survey once they get their notification. It should only take approxiably 5-10 minutes to complete and the survey will be open for 90 days.

#### **TECHNICAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE (TAC)**

- a. Report– Chairman of the TAC Leon Bell announced that the TAC had moved their dates with the changes to the EMS Commission meetings and moved to the opposite months. They also reviewed the reporting tool for the waivers. They have ask the field staff to bring back the waiver tool that the providers have reported so they can review the results. The also reviewed the number of paramedics licensed in Indiana and number of EMT certified in Indiana vs those historical numbers. No recommendations at this time.

#### **INDIANA EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES ASSOCIATION (IEMSA)**

Nathaniel Metz wanted to thank everyone that supported with conference in November 2016 and reported that the IEMSA Conference is scheduled for November 10 & 11, 2017. No location at this time. Also reported that the EMS Legislative breakfast is scheduled for February 9, 2017. Please feel free to come to the state house and support them. IEMSA has approved volunteer EMS Agencies to join the Association free of charge. IEMSA is planning on a doing an analysis of the supplemental reimbursement Medicaid program. One of the items is to find out what providers have not taken advantage of this program yet. 920 license plates have been sold in Indiana.

## **EMS EDUCATION WORKING GROUP**

Mr. Jeffrey Quinn reported that the group met and elected new leadership. Mr. Quinn as elected as the new Chair and George Schulp is the new vice chair. Jana Szostek will be remain the secretary. The meeting schedule will be March 8,( IVY Tech), April 27<sup>th</sup> (FDIC), June 14<sup>th</sup>, (Ivy Tech), September (IERC), November 8<sup>th</sup> (Ivy Tech). The group reviewed and finalized the current EMR and EMT psychomotor skills exam sheets to make sure they are aligned with the national education standards. A couple of them have been changed and will be going out to all primary instructors very soon. They are also looking at trying to visit high performing training institution and learn some best practices and share those with other training institutions. The education working group now has their own website. The site is <http://ieewg.org/>

## **PERSONNEL WAIVER REQUESTS**

The following is requesting a waiver of Emergency Rule LSA Document #12-393(E), SECTION 58. (a) This SECTION supersedes 836 IAC 4-9-6. (c) Notwithstanding subsection (b), any nonresident of Indiana who possesses a certificate or license as a paramedic that is valid in another state, upon residing at an Indiana address, may apply to the agency for temporary licensure as a paramedic. Upon receipt of a valid application and verification of valid status by the agency, the agency may issue temporary licensure that shall be valid for:

- (1) the duration of the applicant's current certificate or license; or
- (2) a period not to exceed six (6) months from the date that the reciprocity request is approved by the director; whichever period of time is shorter. A person receiving temporary licensure may apply for full licensure using the procedure required in 836 IAC 4-9-1.

**Mr. Hynek 4945-7487** is requesting an additional 6 month temporary of this paramedic license. The temporary was issued on August 18, 2016. Mr. Hynek is requesting this extension because of the company growth and has been unable to apply enough time to make the requirements of testing. Staff recommendation was to deny the request based on the rules.

**A motion was made by Commissioner Brown to approve staff recommendation to deny. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Bowman. The motion was passed.**

The following requested a waiver of **836 IAC 4-4-1 General certification provisions,**

- (b) The applicant shall apply for certification on forms provided by the agency postmarked within one (1) year of the date that the course was concluded as shown on the course report.

**Ms. Schilling** is requesting a waiver to allow her one more chance at taking the EMT written exam. Ms. Schilling was injured on a fire scene and had a 10 day hospital stay. She has also had some family issues the night before his test. Staff recommendation was to deny the waiver.

## **PROVIDER WAIVER REQUESTS**

### **Albany EMS Inc.**

#### **836 IAC 2-2-1 General requirements for paramedic provider organizations**

- (g) Each paramedic provider organization shall do the following:
- (1) Maintain an adequate number of trained personnel and emergency response vehicles to provide continuous, twenty-four
  - (24) hour advanced life support services.

**Albany EMS Inc.** is requesting a waiver of the 24 hour rule. They are currently applying to upgrade to a paramedic certification and are hiring ADV EMT's and Paramedics. They are currently served by Delaware County EMS with paramedic coverage now. They also have medical director approval for this waiver.

**Staff recommends: Approve – based on previous commission action.**

A motion was made by Commissioner Valentine to approve the staff recommendation. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Zartman. The motion passed.

### **St. Mary's Warrick EMS**

#### **836 IAC 2-2-1 General requirements for paramedic provider organizations**

- (h) A paramedic ambulance service provider organization must be able to provide a paramedic level response. For the purpose of this subsection, "paramedic response" consists of the following:
- (1) A paramedic.
  - (2) An emergency medical technician or higher.
  - (3) An ambulance in compliance with the requirements of section 3(e) of this rule.
  - (4) During transport of the patient, the following are the minimum staffing requirements:
    - (A) If paramedic level advanced life support treatment techniques have been initiated or are needed:
      - (i) the ambulance must be staffed by at least a paramedic and an emergency medical technician; and
      - (ii) a paramedic shall be in the patient compartment.
    - (B) If an emergency medical technician-intermediate level advanced life support treatment techniques have been initiated or are needed:

- (i) the ambulance must be staffed by at least an emergency medical technician-intermediate and an emergency medical technician; and
- (ii) an emergency medical technician-intermediate shall be in the patient compartment.

(C) If advanced life support treatment techniques have not been initiated and are not needed:

- (i) the ambulance must be staffed by at least an emergency medical technician; and
- (ii) an emergency medical technician shall be in the patient compartment.

**St. Mary's Warrick EMS** is requesting a waiver to allow the EMT and Paramedic to each drive an ambulance during a response of twins being transported by the NICU team.

**Staff recommends:    Approve**

**A motion was made by Commissioner Valentine to approve the staff recommendation. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Wood. The motion passed.**

#### **OLD BUSINESS**

**a. National Registry Implementation Briefings**

Robin gave an updated on the briefings that staff and Rob Wagner are going around the state regarding the state EMT written exam moving to national registry. We still have approximately 250 primary instructors that have not attended a briefing to this date.

**b. Advanced EMT Testing – John Zartman**

John Zartman gave an update regarding the ADV EMT course. John stated that there was a review of the Indiana addendum of the cardiac rhythm interpretation and manual defibrillation as well as reviewing the national education standards and speaking with members of the TAC and training institutions that there was not real advantage for Indiana to continue teaching the cardiac rhythm interpretation and also the additional Indiana state exam covering this additional training. There has been a large failure rate of the Indiana specific cardiac exam and John would like to ask the Commission to drop the Indiana specific course information and Indiana specific cardiac written exam from the requirement to become certified as an ADV EMT. John recommended that the current ADV EMT's that are already trained and certified with the additional cardiac rhythm interpretation and manual defibrillation be allowed to maintain and continued the rhythm interpretation and manual defibrillation until such time the Commission votes on a date for them to longer utilize the additional training of rhythm interpretation. There was Commission discussion regarding time frame and how to accommodate all the current students in different stages of training and testing. Commissioner Mackey does not feel that we should cut those currently trained and certified off right away. Tony Pagano suggested that we stop the additional testing immediately but have those training institutions currently teaching an ADV EMT course to be responsible to still complete that additional training. Any training institutions applying for a new ADV EMT course will no longer be required to teach the additional Indiana addendum. There was discussion that this has been very confusing and John stated that we want to get back to the national education standards with no extra training or Indiana specific requirements. Tony asked about those courses currently

going on that have had students that have completed the training and taken the Indiana specific cardiac rhythm exam and have failed. Commission Valentine stated that if we do away with additional Indiana specific cardiac exam and those students have taken and passed the national registry that we let them be certified. Commissioner Brown stated that we are creating two different levels of ADV EMT's and ALS provider organizations at the ADV EMT level. We would never be able to keep straight what personnel and providers are at what level. We have personnel that work for different providers and this would create more problems if we allow personnel and providers to function at different levels of ADV EMT. John realizes this this would still fragment the system for now but if we give a date to allow those currently certified personnel to function until December 31, 2017 but after that date all ADV EMT will no longer be able to do the rhythm interpretation. Chairman Turpen stated that from the evidence based perspective and looking at the national education standard there is no value to having that skill at the level. From the patient perspective it provides no benefit to the patient but increases cost.

**Commissioner Valentine made a motion to immediately stop all testing of the Indiana module at the ADV EMT. If there are any ADV EMT's that currently certified with National Registry but have failed the Indiana exam and meet all other requirements, be certified in Indiana and all the currently certified Indiana personnel be allowed to function until December 31, 2017. This allows those providers operationally to make changes before December 31, 2017. Those currently in ADV EMT class, those training institutions will stop teaching the additional Indiana module. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Zartman. The motion passes. To be clear on those personnel that have been taught the ECG rhythm interpretation but have not tested competency of the ECG rhythm interpretation may not function at that level.**

- c. NREMT CCCP standards – John Zartman  
John gave an update to the Commission at the last EMS Commission meeting it was approved to move to the NCCP standards. John stated they were ask to modify that to give some leverage to the provider to make sure that their specific needs are addressed. The other items was we thought it was very important to have audit and review required. He has spoken to several members of TAC and he feels they should have a formal motion at the next meeting. Chairman Turpen wants to make sure that we leave space for any Indiana specific training.
- d. Tables Business and/or waivers- Logansport Fire Department.  
Staff pulled this waiver per the provider's request.
- e. Current ongoing studies- none at this time

## **NEW BUSINESS**

- a. Appointment of new Administrative Law Judge – Pam Walters  
Pam Walters informed the EMS Commission that the previous administrative law judge is longer with the agency and the Commission will need to authorize a new one.

**Commission Valentine made a motion to authorize Chelsea E. Smith to serve as administrative law judge under IC 4-21.5 for the Emergency Medical Service Commission, including, without limitation, the authority to:**

1. Assume all pending administrative cases before the Commission with ultimate authority for these actions resting with the Commission.
2. Act as administrative law judge for all new cases to come before the Commission with the ultimate authority for these actions resting with the Commission:
3. Hear and rule upon petitions for stays of enforcement as the ultimate authority for the Commission:  
and

4. Hear and decide appeals to Emergency Orders issued with respect to one or more violations of the Commission statutes or rules as ultimate authority for the Commission.

**Commission Hoggatt seconded the motion. Motion passes.**

- b. Use of Regional Mutual Aid for Air-Ground Communications – Jason Smith
- c. P25 Roll-out report – Jason Smith

Jason Smith reported that the P25 phase 1, 2 and 3 are all in place and phase 4 will be completed soon and phase 5 will not be very far behind. There has been three separate groups meeting to discuss better ways to make it better coordinate the air to ground communication. Those groups are, IDHS, Indiana Air Medical Association and IPSEC. Jason also notified the Commission of the FirstNet seminars around the state.

**Commissioner Valentine made a motion that the EMS Commission recognize the regional mutual aid on the state system channel #4 be the best practice for air to ground medical communications. Commissioner Mackey second the motion. Motion passes.**

- d. Meeting with Bowen Center for Health Workforce – Mike Garvey

Mike Garvey stated that staff had a meeting with representatives and they came to us to do some research to come up with plan to address the workforce issues in emergency medical services. We have recognized that there is a shortage. They would like us to start collecting some data to give them. We are going to meeting with them again regarding the data and how to collect and get that data to them.

### **Sub-Committee report**

#### **Run report group**

Mike Garvey reported that the group met on January 19<sup>th</sup> at Greenwood. We had very good discussion and came up with good ideas of what needs to be on a run sheet. There were basically four goals that the group agreed on. Those were to move to facilitate the use of electronic run form and data, continued to support the Image Trend data collection, turn the run report form into a hand off form that is easier to give the hospital the information they need and work with Indiana Medicaid on reimbursement. We know you cannot collect 225 data element on a run sheet so we are working to develop a realistic a list of items that hospital needs for EMS to deliver the patient to the hospital. Commissioner Bowman also commented that there are really two masters that they are trying to service. One being the billing company but the other is who you are delivering your patient to. They need to have a good continuity of care and to deliver a good bedside report, what you saw, what you heard and what you did.

## **STAFF REPORTS**

- A. Data Report – Mr. Michael Lockard discussed the Elite server was up and they are proceeding with programing the required elements. They are also meeting with legal to get the Indiana Administrative Code updated. Mr. Lockard asked Mr. Garvey to talk about the meeting with National Collaborative for Bio Preparedness, housed in University of North Carolina (NCBP). Mike spoke that this is a program funded by the federal homeland security and they are taking EMS data and hospital data and develop real time surveillance data. Indianapolis EMS is currently participating. This data will would be to give us within a few hours if something was happening with real time analysis. There will be more information coming. Mr. Lockard stated that in order to participate they need two additional items that we do not currently require. They need the street address of the incident and apartment or room of incident number if necessary. Mr. Lockard would like the Commission to add those to the requirements.

**A motion was made by Commissioner Hoggatt to add those two additional items to data collection. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Zartman. The motion passed.**

- B. Operations Report – Ms. Robin Stump reported that Elizabeth has moved to the State Training Officer and Stan Frank has taken over as district manager. Adam Johnson was also introduced as the new WMD/EMS Training Officer. Reminded everyone to get provider, supervising hospital and training institutions renewal applications in within 60 days prior to expiration date. Also discussed the upcoming moulage and mass fatality classes.
- C. Compliance Report- Mrs. Candice Pope reported that reciprocity application were 230 in 2016. She stated staff has done two reviews of violation paperwork. During those reviews staff had 1 emergency suspension, 3 two year probations orders and 6 one year probation orders issued. We currently have 25 either suspensions or emergency orders in place.

- E. Training Report – (see attachment #6) – Mr. Tony Pagano spoke about the pass rates with national registry. Reminded that the primary instructors need to teach to the national education standards not to the book. The state EMT exam for 2015 we are averaging 85.7%. The national registry in 2016 at the EMT level we are averaging 73%.

**STATE EMS MEDICAL DIRECTOR'S REPORT** - Dr. Olinger reported about the medical directors EMS Conference. He also reminded everyone that all providers will soon be required to be reporting NEMSIS 3.4 data through the state website. He also spoke about the stroke legislation currently going through the process.



**STATE EMS DIRECTOR'S REPORT** - Director Garvey reported that with the new Governor that the agency has a new Executive Director Brian Langley. Fire Marshal Greeson was reappointed. He stated he was able to sit down with the new director and is very encouraged with changes that are coming. Brandon Wood also spoke the learning management system. He introduced Andrew Darby working on all the learning management training sessions.

**CHAIRMAN'S REPORT AND DIRECTION-** Chairman Turpen commented on the volume of training that is going to be going on in 2017. There are a lot of high quality topics this year and hopes everyone takes advance of some of this training. There was also discussion of the May EMS Commission meeting. Staff will work on alternative dates for May EMS Commission meeting.



To Whom It May Concern,

I am writing this letter to the commission to ask for an honorary lifetime membership for a paramedic that has gone above and beyond the call of duty for more than 40 years. Joseph Paunicka (PSID 9708-0386), was in the first ever paramedic course granted by the State of Indiana. The first course was held at Methodist Hospitals, Gary Campus in 1974. Joseph Paunicka graduated from that class and went on to serve in many different capacities with different providers throughout the region, now known as District 1. Mr. Paunicka will be best known for his development of the Regional Coordination Center and the paramedic program at Methodist Hospitals. In April of 1976, The State of Indiana designated The Methodist Hospitals as the Regional Coordination Center, the training center for all the area providers; Mr. Paunicka was the lead instructor & program director for the paramedic training. Joe spent the next 22 years developing the program into a leading institution for EMT and Paramedic training in the area. In 1998, Joe left the program for a different adventure, but returned to the Regional Coordination Center in 2000. In 2000, Joe was influential in developing a paramedic program that met accreditation standards, a full 15 years before accreditation was mandated for all paramedic programs. From 2000 till 2011, Joe served as the EMS Coordinator and the Program Director for the paramedic program. In 2012, Joe decided it was time to retire from the career that he loved so much. I was fortunate to be hand selected to replace Joe in the paramedic program. Although Joe retired from the full time position, he continued to teach in the paramedic program. Till this day, Joe continues to teach the anatomy and physiology portion of the course, as well as maintaining his ACLS & PALS instructor certifications. Joe also retained his Regional Facility for American Heath Association and plans on maintaining that title.

I am honored to have been trained by Joe, and call him a friend. When Joe told me that he was letting his paramedic certification expire, I felt that the EMS world lost a true pioneer. Joe will always be a paramedic, and one of the most knowledgeable and influential paramedics in the state of Indiana. Joe has had his hand in the development of more paramedics than can be counted.

All of these examples are just a few of what Joe means to EMS. I am asking the commission to honor Joe and the work that he has done for over 40 years with an honorary lifetime paramedic certification. I want to give something back to Joe for all the hours that he gave to our community. I ask the commission to grant this certification.
