NON-FINAL ORDER OF DISMISSAL



Indiana Code § 4-21.5-3-29(d) requires any party seeking to preserve an objection to this order for judicial review to file a written objection that

1. identifies the basis of the objection with reasonable particularity; and
2. is filed with the Commission within fifteen (15) days (or any longer period set by statute) after this order is served.

In the absence of an objection from a party or notice from the Commission of its intent to review any issue related to this order, the Commission shall affirm this order in accordance with Indiana Code § 4-21.5-3-29(c). **This order will be considered by the Commission at its next scheduled meeting, Tuesday, January 3, 2017 at 9:00 a.m.**
