Key Messages

How to Appeal a Determination Letter

If you receive a letter from FEMA that says you were not approved for disaster assistance, read it carefully to learn why. If you believe you should be eligible, within 60 days, gather the documents requested, write a letter to explain why you're appealing, then submit the documents, letter and cover page from the determination letter in one of these ways:

- Mail to FEMA National Processing Service Center, P.O. Box 10055, Hyattsville, MD 20782-7055
- Fax to 800-827-8112 (Attention: FEMA)
- Or visit DisasterAssistance.gov and click "Apply Online."

Beware of Disaster Fraud

If you believe you are the victim of a scam, report it immediately to your local police or sheriff's department. Consumers may also report charity or disaster scams to the Consumer Protection Division of the Office of Indiana Attorney General online at indianaconsumer.com.

Individual Assistance Overview

FEMA Individual Assistance may include funds for:

- Temporary housing while you are unable to live in your home
- The repair or replacement of owner-occupied primary residences
- Other uninsured or under-insured disaster-caused expenses and serious needs, such as repair or replacement of personal property and vehicles, moving and storage, medical, dental, childcare and funeral expenses

How to Apply for FEMA Assistance

Individuals in the 12 designated counties who had uninsured or underinsured losses from the March 31 – April 1 storms may be eligible for federal assistance. There are three ways to apply:

1. Visit DisasterAssistance.gov
2. Download the [FEMA App](#) for mobile devices
3. Call toll-free **800-621-3362**. The helpline is available from 7 a.m. to 1 a.m. Eastern Time in most languages. If you use a relay service such as video relay service (VRS), captioned telephone service or others, give FEMA your number for that service.

Disaster Survivor Assistance teams are also going door-to-door to assist with registration and answer questions.

Do not wait to file an insurance claim. You still need to register with FEMA even if you reported your damage to local officials or spoke to FEMA during the damage assessments in early April. If you are unsure if you are registered for FEMA assistance, contact the helpline at 800-621-3362.

U.S. Small Business Administration

Long-term, low-interest disaster loans for homeowners, renters, businesses and nonprofits are available from the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) to cover losses not fully compensated by insurance and other sources. Apply online at disasterloanassistance.sba.gov/ela/s/, or call the SBA's Customer Service Center at 800-659-2955.

BY THE NUMBERS

- Over **\$3,639,000** in federal funds has been provided to Hoosiers to help with their recovery:

 - \$2,299,400 in SBA loans
