# FY 2023 Nonprofit Security Grant Program Fact Sheet

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In Fiscal Year (FY) 2023, the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) is providing \$305 million for facility hardening and other physical security enhancements and activities to nonprofit organizations that are at high risk of terrorist or other extremist attack.

#### **Overview**

The FY 2023 Nonprofit Security Grant Program (NSGP) is one of three grant programs that support the DHS/Federal Emergency Management Agency's (FEMA) focus on enhancing the ability of state, local, tribal, and territorial governments, as well as nonprofit organizations, to prevent, prepare for, protect against, and respond to terrorist or other extremist attacks. These grant programs are part of a comprehensive set of measures authorized by Congress and implemented by DHS to help strengthen the nation's communities against potential terrorist or other extremist attacks.

## **Funding**

In FY 2023, the total amount of funds available under NSGP is \$305 million, of which \$152.5 million is for NSGP- Urban Area (UA) and \$152.5 million is for NSGP-State (S). NSGP-UA funding will be awarded to nonprofit organizations that are located within one of the FY 2023 Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI)-designated high-risk urban areas. NSGP-S funding is for nonprofit organizations located outside the FY 2023 UASI-designated high-risk urban areas. The FY 2023 NSGP Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) includes a list of the FY 2023 UASI



high-risk urban areas.

## **Eligibility**

The State Administrative Agency (SAA) is the only entity eligible to apply for FY 2023 NSGP funds. The SAA applies to FEMA on behalf of eligible nonprofit organizations (sub-applicants) that are at high risk of terrorist or other extremist attack. Eligible nonprofit organizations are those organizations described under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 and exempt from tax under section 501(a) of such Code. For NSGP-UA, nonprofit organizations must be located within one of the FY 2023 UASI-designated high-risk urban areas listed in the FY 2023 NSGP NOFO. For NSGP-S, nonprofit organizations may be located anywhere within a state or territory outside of a UASI-designated high-risk urban area.

### **Management and Administration**

SAAs can use up to 5% of their total NSGP-S and NSGP-UA awards for management and administration (M&A) purposes. Nonprofit organization subrecipients may also continue to use up to 5% of their subaward for M&A purposes.

## **Funding Guidelines**

FY 2023 NSGP allowable costs are focused on security-related activities. Funding can be used for contracted security personnel; security-related planning, exercises, and training; and the acquisition and installation of security equipment (including improvements) on real property (including buildings) owned or leased by the nonprofit organization at the time of application.

# **Application Process**



Applying for an award under the NSGP is a multi-step process. Applicants are encouraged to register early, as the registration process can take four weeks or more to complete. Therefore, registration should be done in sufficient time to ensure it does not impact your ability to meet required submission deadlines. Please refer to Section D in the FY 2023 NSGP NOFO for detailed information and instructions.

Eligible applicants should submit their initial application at least three days before the May 18, 2023, application deadline through the Grants.gov portal at <a href="https://www.grants.gov">www.grants.gov</a>. Eligible applicants will be notified by FEMA and asked to proceed with submitting their complete application package in the Non-Disaster (ND) Grants System. Completed applications must be submitted no later than 5 p.m. ET by the deadline included in the NOFO.
