




EMS DEMAND IS PROJECTED TO CONTINUE

- + Changing Paradigm
 - + From 2014-2060, population will increase by 31%
 - + To meet the growing population needs for 2030, workforce demand may increase by 11%



Note: All Occupations includes all occupations in the U.S. Economy. Source: U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, Employment Projections program




EMS Personnel Certifications by Group 2005-2022

INDIANA EMS RUN VOLUME – LAST 5 YRS



INDIANA PARAMEDIC SHORTAGE



While the run volume has increased significantly in the past few years, the number of EMS providers remains fairly unchanged.

EMS WORKFORCE

- The certifications trends are only part of the story.
- How many EMS certified or licensed personnel are not "active," meaning not performing traditional ambulance response?
- We have civilian paramedics in the fire service (former FF/paramedics now on fire apparatus but remain certified), MIH providers, EMS administration and hospital employment.
- There are also providers who are working in non-EMS jobs and continue to hold their EMS certifications.



EMS WORKFORCE




One method to determine number of active users is to look for unique identifiers by certification level as listed in the ImageTrend run sheet statewide database as a participant in an EMS response.

Then compare the number of certified EMS professionals at their certification level against the number of unique identifiers in the crew listings in the run database.

EMT "active users" in state ePCR system




Summary: the four-year average of certified EMTs that were listed at least once in the state run report system during a year is 27.95%.

STATEWIDE CHANGES TO ADDRESS WORKFORCE

- Systems are re-evaluating/"do more with less"
 - Pre-screen 911 calls.
 - Divert non-emergency to other resources such as MIH.
 - Re-organize 911 systems to send out BLS crews for initial evaluation for many calls and have paramedics available for intercept.
 - Many systems are dropping non-emergent transports such as hospital transports.
 - Relying upon mutual aid either in shared resources or having other agencies in the area assist when call volume is at a peak.

Recommendations

Recommendation 23: Ensure local level EMS readiness through expansion and sustainability of EMS workforce.

Action items:

- A. IDOH in conjunction with the EMS Commission, will conduct a needs assessment of specific EMS gaps in local jurisdictions.
- B. Ensure funding for prioritized recruitment to address EMS workforce shortages and provide mechanisms for cost-sharing related to equipment purchases, particularly in underserved and geographically remote areas of the State.
- C. Establish long-term promotional and retention plans for EMS personnel.
- D. Enhance ongoing higher-level EMS training and expansion of community paramedicine programs.
- E. Improve health outcomes related to preventable injuries and other trauma through enhanced analysis and educational initiatives, increased access to EMS, and other efforts to strengthen the trauma system.

WHAT IS THE STATE EMS OFFICE DOING?



- Working with the legislature and governor's office to create pilot funding for workforce and education funding directed at EMS.
- Indiana is conducting an EMS workforce study via the Bowen Center at Indiana University.
 - Joint effort by the Indiana Department of Health and IDHS.
 - This study will generate data during 2023 and establish an on-going data collection.
- Indiana is one of five states participating in an EMS workforce study being conducted by the National Association of State EMS Officials (NASEMSO).

SUMMARY



- The shortage did not happen suddenly. EMS has been a tightly staffed workforce, but new challenges and opportunities are exposing how significant the shortage is.
- We did not get into this overnight and will not correct it overnight. There are short-term fixes but long-term planning will be needed.
